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HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO ESTABLISH A TASK FORCE TO DEVELOP LONG-TERM SOLUTIONS TO EFFECTIVELY PROTECT THE LIVESTOCK INDUSTRY IN HAWAII.

1	WHEREAS, Hawaii's livestock industry faces numerous		
2	challenges that create obstacles towards obtaining a strong and		
3	diversified livestock industry in the State; and		
4			
5	WHEREAS, according to the Department of Agriculture, in		
6	2006, locally produced eggs represented approximately thirty-		
7	three per cent of the total eggs sold in the State, and		
8	approximately thirty to thirty-five per cent of the milk		
9	consumed in the State was locally produced; and		
10			
11	WHEREAS, within the past year, two egg farms and a dairy		
12	farm have closed in Hawaii, and a dairy farm and another egg		
13	farm are now threatened with closure; and		
14			
15	WHEREAS, one of the challenges the livestock industry faces		
16	is the rising cost of livestock feed; and		
17			
18	WHEREAS, due to its location and relative geographic		
19	isolation, Hawaii relies heavily on overseas shipping for a		
20	majority of its food and products for food production, thus,		
21	livestock farmers rely on imported feed from the mainland to		
22	satisfy their feed requirements; and		
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24	WHEREAS, local poultry farmers, for example, have indicated		
25	that the total cost of grain or feed for their livestock amounts		
26	to seventy per cent of the cost to produce one dozen eggs, with		
27	fifty per cent of that cost attributed to the transportation		
28	expenses for the feed; and		
29 30	WHEREAS, furthermore, with increased United States		
30 31	Department of Agriculture regulations on agricultural products,		
31 32	livestock farmers are forced to buy and use high-protein feed		
34	TIVESCOCK farmers are forced to buy and use high-procern feed		

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from the mainland to feed their livestock because grains, such 1 as corn, are too expensive to grow locally in Hawaii to satisfy 2 3 the quantities that are required by livestock farmers; and 4 WHEREAS, the high transportation costs for feed is a 5 perennial problem for livestock farmers and the cost of 6 importing feed grains from the mainland adds more than \$100 a 7 8 ton to the expense; and 9 WHEREAS, the Department of Agriculture recognizes that the 10 longevity of Hawaii's livestock industry is threatened due to 11 the high costs of supporting this industry, and has introduced 12 in the Legislature S.B. No. 1307 and H.B. No. 1221 during the 13 2007 Regular Session that creates a livestock revitalization 14 program; and 15 16 WHEREAS, if enacted into law, the livestock revitalization 17 program will allow the Department of Agriculture to provide 18 grants to qualified producers to reimburse these producers for a 19 percentage of their feed expenses; and 20 21 WHEREAS, however, the livestock revitalization program is a 22 short-term solution to a problem that is in desperate need of a 23 permanent solution to effectively protect the livestock industry 24 in Hawaii; now, therefore, 25 26 27 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 28 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 29 Agriculture is requested to establish a task force to discuss 30 and develop long-term solutions to effectively protect the 31 livestock industry in Hawaii; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force includes the 34 35 following members: 36 37 (1)The Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture or the Chairperson's designee; 38 39 The Dean of the College of Tropical Agriculture and (2) 40 Human Resources at the University of Hawaii or the 41 Dean's designee; 42 43
