HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING A FINANCIAL AND MANAGEMENT AUDIT OF THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION SYSTEM OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT AND DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, the State has long adhered to the public policy that it is in the best interests of our citizenry to protect employees when they are ill or injured; and
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5	WHEREAS, wage replacement programs such as the Workers'
6	Compensation Law and the Temporary Disability Insurance Law were
7 8	enacted specifically because the Legislature acknowledged the
8 9	importance of making employees "whole" during times of illness and injury, not only for the benefit of the worker, but also for
9 10	the stability of businesses and our economy, and the health and
11	welfare of our people; and
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13	WHEREAS, Hawaii's workers' compensation law was established
14	to provide benefits in a prompt and accurate manner to employees
15	who sustain a work-related injury or illness; and
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17	WHEREAS, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations
18 19	(DLIR), through its Disability Compensation Division (Division), has the overall responsibility of administering the workers'
19 20	compensation law, including the supervision and execution of
20 21	prompt and accurate compensation payments; and
22	prompt and accurace compensation payments, and
23	WHEREAS, for injured employees to recover from their work-
24	related injuries and get back to work in a timely manner, the
25	processing of workers' compensation claims must be completed as
26	expeditiously as possible; and
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28	WHEREAS, over the years, numerous concerns have been raised
29 30	over the administration of workers' compensation claims by employers, employees, insurers, and healthcare providers; and
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WHEREAS, a backlog of open workers' compensation cases has 1 delayed the processing of claims and the rendering of decisions 2 by the Division, prompting DLIR to try to streamline its process 3 and make the filing of claims and dispensing of cases more 4 efficient: and 5 6 WHEREAS, the healthcare community has also raised concerns 7 8 about the difficulty of providing healthcare in workers' 9 compensation cases due to low reimbursement rates; and 10 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii, especially the Department of 11 12 Human Resources Development (DHRD) and Department of Education 13 (DOE), employs thousands of individuals, a certain percentage of 14 whom will experience workplace injuries; and 15 WHEREAS, questions have been raised about issues and 16 problems arising from the methods used to deal with workers' 17 compensation cases involving government employees and as to 18 whether there is any significant difference in the issues and 19 problems as they affect private sector employees; now, 20 21 therefore, 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 23 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 24 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Legislative 25 Auditor (Auditor) is requested to conduct a financial and 26 management audit of the workers' compensation system as it 27 relates to state employees under the jurisdiction of DHRD and 28 DOE, and identify any problems or issues that may exist within 29 30 these systems; and 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 32 determine if any differences exist between costs associated with 33 the workers' compensation system afforded to government 34 35 employees and employers, and the workers' compensation system used by private sector employees and employers; and 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor submit a report of 38 39 its findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than 20 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 40 41 2008; and 42
