# HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

---

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES AND DEPARTMENT OF  
EDUCATION TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL OUTREACH SERVICES TO  
HOMELESS INFANTS, CHILDREN, AND YOUTH IN HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, approximately 15 percent of the homeless  
2 population in Hawaii are children; and  
3

4 WHEREAS, almost 1,800 children resided in emergency and  
5 transitional shelters in Hawaii in 2004-2005; and  
6

7 WHEREAS, in 2006, approximately 1,000 children ages five  
8 through 17 enrolled in Hawaii schools were homeless; and  
9

10 WHEREAS, homeless children are especially vulnerable to  
11 malnutrition, physical abuse, disease, sexual exploitation,  
12 illiteracy, and drug abuse; and  
13

14 WHEREAS, risks to homeless children become more acute where  
15 the child suffers from a disability or has special needs; and  
16

17 WHEREAS, homeless children frequently lack access to basic  
18 needs and services such as food, clothing, shelter, health care,  
19 and education; now, therefore,  
20

21 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
22 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular  
23 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Department of  
24 Human Services (DHS) and Department of Education (DOE) are  
25 requested to develop programs to provide medical check-ups for  
26 homeless children upon arrival at homeless shelters, schedule  
27 educational activities within the shelter for homeless children,  
28 and provide shelter employees with training to address the  
29 special needs of children; and



1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that DHS is requested to:

- 3 (1) Provide outreach services to homeless infants,  
4 children, and youth who do not live in shelters;  
5
- 6 (2) Increase services targeted to homeless infants,  
7 children, and youth;  
8
- 9 (3) Provide financial assistance to organizations that  
10 serve homeless infants, children, and youth;  
11
- 12 (4) Offer a plan to increase efforts to provide basic  
13 services and assistance to homeless infants, children,  
14 and youth, including food, shelter, health,  
15 transportation, and education, and also to address  
16 issues that affect homeless children such as abuse,  
17 neglect, exploitation, mental illness, drug abuse, and  
18 the special needs of children with disabilities;

- 20 (5) Offer a plan to increase funding for parent  
21 participation programs and training; and  
22
- 23 (6) Coordinate the efforts of the Interagency Council on  
24 Homelessness with the Interdepartmental Council for  
25 Early Childhood Education;

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that DHS and DOE are requested to  
30 report its implementation plan to the Legislature no later than  
31 20 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2008;

34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
35 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human  
36 Services, Superintendent of Education, and Chairperson of the  
37 Board of Education.
