HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES AND DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL OUTREACH SERVICES TO HOMELESS INFANTS, CHILDREN, AND YOUTH IN HAWAII.

1	WHEREAS, approximately 15 percent of the homeless		
2	population in Hawaii are children; and		
3 4	WHEREAS, almost 1,800 children resided in emergency and		
5	transitional shelters in Hawaii in 2004-2005; and		
6			
7	WHEREAS, in 2006, approximately 1,000 children ages five		
8	through 17 enrolled in Hawaii schools were homeless; and		
9 10	WHEREAS, homeless children are especially vulnerable to		
11	malnutrition, physical abuse, disease, sexual exploitation,		
12	illiteracy, and drug abuse; and

14	WHEREAS, risks to homeless children become more acute where		
15	the child suffers from a disability or has special needs; and		
16 17	WHEREAS, homeless children frequently lack access to basic		
18	needs and services such as food, clothing, shelter, health care,		
19	and education; now, therefore,

21	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the		
22	Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular		
23	Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Department of		
24 25	Human Services (DHS) and Department of Education (DOE) are requested to develop programs to provide medical check-ups for		
25 26	homeless children upon arrival at homeless shelters, schedule		
20 27	educational activities within the shelter for homeless children,		
28	and provide shelter employees with training to address the		
29	special needs of children; and
