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1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10	WHEREAS, throughout 2004 and 2005 the Office of Planning sought input from the Hawaii Ocean and Coastal Council, Marine and Coastal Zone Advisory Council, Office of Hawaiian Affairs, Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs, various community groups, ocean users, environmental nonprofits, and members of the general public and held a workshop regarding issues, priorities, and recommendation that should be included in the updated Ocean Resources Management Plan; and		
11 12 13	WHEREAS, the Hawaii Ocean and Coastal Council held monthly meetings between May and October 2005 and produced long-term goals and prioritized tiers of short- to mid-term goals; and		
14 15 16 17 18 19	WHEREAS, the Office of Hawaiian Affairs held "Community Conversations" on each island to allow the Hawaiian community to share their concerns and knowledge about ocean and coastal issues for inclusion into the Ocean Resources Management Plan; and		
20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27	WHEREAS, the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs gave approximately seventeen informational presentations to various public and private agencies on the ahupua'a concept, the need for ecosystem management, the negative impacts of overlapping jurisdictions, and need for public involvement in the planning process; and		
28 29 30	WHEREAS, the Office of Planning held meetings with a variety of ocean and coastal organizations regarding the Ocean Resources Management Plan; and

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1 2 WHEREAS, the Ocean Resources Management Plan implementation 3 working group was created, consisting of the Department of Agriculture, Department of Business, Economic Development, and 4 Tourism, Office of Hawaiian Affairs, Department of Land and 5 Natural Resources, Department of Health, Department of 6 Transportation, the four county planning agencies, and private 7 business representatives, and met to discuss the framework, 8 9 identify priorities, and review drafts of the plan; and 10 WHEREAS, in September and October 2006, the Office of 11 Planning held a series of public meetings throughout the State 12 to gather input and comments on the final draft of the Ocean 13 Resources Management Plan; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the draft was generally well received by the 16 public; and 17 18 WHEREAS, the Ocean Resources Management Plan is built upon 19 a three perspective framework for achieving management goals and 20 strategic actions for five-year implementation phases over the 21 22 next thirty years: 23 Perspective 1: Connecting Land and Sea which reflects 24 (1)the traditional Hawaiian concept of ahupua'a 25 management that recognizes the interconnectedness of 26 27 land and sea; 28 (2) Perspective 2: Preserving Our Ocean Heritage which 29 reflects the traditional Hawaiian management of 30 fisheries and coastal resources as well as a deep 31 understanding of and caring for the marine 32 environment; and 33 34 35 (3) Perspective 3: Promoting Collaboration and Stewardship which reflects the need for a holistic 36 37 approach to natural resource management; and 38 39 WHEREAS, the Ocean Resources Management Plan provides a quide and integrated approach toward the management of our ocean 40 41 and coastal resources; and 42 43 WHEREAS, the need to implement the Ocean Resources 44 Management Plan is imperative as Hawaii is facing significant HCR LRB 07-3384.doc



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changes over the next twenty years, including increased 1 2 urbanization, tourism, recreational and commercial ocean uses, sea level rise and other natural hazards, marine debris, and 3 4 invasive species; and 5 WHEREAS, the Ocean Resources Management Plan establishes a 6 7 proactive planning process that can mitigate the above impacts on Hawaii's environment; now, therefore, 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 10 twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 11 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature 12 13 hereby endorses the Ocean Resources Management Plan because it establishes a framework for making informed decisions about the 14 use and management of our ocean and coastal resources that is 15 widely supported by the public; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of Planning is 18 19 requested to work with the county and federal governments to implement the goals and strategic actions in the 2006 Ocean 20 21 Resources Management Plan; and 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 23 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the 24 25 Director of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, the Director of the Office of Planning, the Comptroller, the 26 Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture, the Director of 27 Finance, the Adjutant General and the Director of Civil Defense, 28 the Chairperson of the Board of Education, the Superintendent of 29 Education, the Chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes Commission, the 30 Director of Health, the Director of Labor and Industrial 31 Relations, the Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural 32 Resources, the Director of Taxation, the Director of 33 Transportation, the President of the University of Hawaii, the 34 Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian 35 Affairs, the Chairperson of the Marine and Coastal Zone 36 Management Council, the Chairperson of the Hawaii Ocean and 37 Coastal Council, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric 38 Administration, the National Marine Sanctuary Program, the 39 National Marine Fisheries Service, the Pacific Services Center, 40
