REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF FORMING A CENTER FOR HYDROGEN BASED ENERGY STUDY.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, Hawaii is an insular state that is geographically isolated in the middle of the Pacific Ocean; and
3 4 5 6	WHEREAS, the State has always been immensely dependent on imported energy, mainly oil; and
7 8	WHEREAS, efforts have been made to increase the use of alternative energy resources; and
9 10 11	WHEREAS, the use of hydrogen-based energy is currently in an experimental stage; and
12 13 14 15	WHEREAS, hydrogen fuel cells are the most promising of the new technologies for nonpolluting, renewable energy generation; and
15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, hydrogen has the potential to be widely used as a source of clean, renewable, efficient energy; and
19 20 21	WHEREAS, the widespread use of hydrogen as a source of electricity and fuel for transportation could be beneficial for
22 23 24	the State of Hawaii as a means of reducing air pollution and decreasing dependence on imported oil and carbon-based fuels; and
24 25 26 27 28	WHEREAS, Hawaii should lead an initiative to research the uses of hydrogen as an energy source and develop marketable hydrogen technology such as fuel cells; now, therefore,
29 30 31	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
