HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING CONGRESS TO ENACT ENABLING LEGISLATION TO PERMIT STATE REGULATION OF INTERISLAND AIR CARRIERS BY AN AIR CARRIER COMMISSION ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO ACT 332, SESSION LAWS OF HAWAII 1993.

WHEREAS, interisland air transportation is of paramount 1 importance to the State and its economy; and 2 3 WHEREAS, being an island state, Hawaii is unique among her 4 sister states in having no major highway system connecting 5 various points throughout the state; and 6 7 WHEREAS, residents and visitors must depend almost 8 exclusively upon interisland air transportation to meet their 9 transport mobility needs; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, consequently, a safe, efficient, and economical interisland air transportation system is essential for the 13 public safety and welfare; and 14 15 WHEREAS, of perhaps even more significance to the state's 16 economy is the availability of frequent, reliable, and 17 economical interisland air cargo transportation; and 18 19 WHEREAS, an increase in air shipping rates or a reduction 20 in the number of flights to carry cargo interisland will 21 undoubtedly have a detrimental effect on Neighbor Island farmers 22 and result in higher prices for all commodities shipped by air, 23 including food, medicine, machinery parts, and clothing; and 24 25 WHEREAS, accordingly, it is critical that Hawaii's 26 interisland air transportation system continue to operate in a 27 competitive environment to protect consumers from price gouging 28 and unacceptable service levels; and 29

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WHEREAS, the Legislature has long been concerned over 1 maintaining a competitive environment for Hawaii's interisland 2 air transportation system; and 3 4 WHEREAS, for example, such concern prompted the 5 Legislature, through Act 332, Session Laws of Hawaii 1993, to 6 establish a comprehensive process to regulate interisland air 7 transportation; and 8 9 WHEREAS, Act 332 established an Air Carrier Commission 10 (Commission) having general supervision over all Hawaii air 11 carriers and any related company that provides air 12 transportation; and 13 14 WHEREAS, Act 332 further provided that no person may engage 15 in intrastate air transportation without having first been 16 granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity by the 17 Commission; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the general powers of the Commission include 20 regulating air carriers through its investigative powers, 21 22 establishing reasonable classifications of air carriers, and adopting rules to regulate those classes; and 23 24 WHEREAS, Act 332 recognized, however, that the federal 25 Airline Deregulation Act of 1978, expressly preempts the states 26 from enacting or enforcing any law, rule, or regulation 27 "relating to rates, routes, or services of any air carrier 28 having federal operating authority"; and 29 30 WHEREAS, furthermore, federal statutes and case law make 31 clear that air travel between the Hawaiian islands is considered 32 interstate or overseas air transportation; and 33 34 WHEREAS, Act 332 therefore made the establishment of an air 35 carrier commission contingent upon enactment of federal 36 legislation permitting such a regulatory scheme; and 37 38 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that in the past, proposed 39 mergers of interisland air carriers would have resulted in one 40 air carrier dominating intrastate air traffic, thus having a 41 tremendous impact on the health, safety, welfare, and general 42 transportation needs of the people of Hawaii; and 43

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1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, the Legislature is concerned that a loss of air carrier competition could have a severely negative impact on residents of and visitors to Hawaii due to:
5	(1) An increase in air passenger ticket and cargo fares;
6 7 8 9	(2) A reduction in the frequency or availability of certain routes; and
10 11 12	(3) An increase in unemployment and its attendant costs to society, as work forces are consolidated;

14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25	WHEREAS, in particular, the Legislature is concerned that loss of interisland air carrier competition could negatively affect the struggling economies of the Neighbor Islands, by reducing visitor travel to the Neighbor Islands, as a result of increased ticket fares and reduced flights, and negatively affect commerce by increasing the cost of goods air shipped by Neighbor Island producers, as well as those shipped to Neighbor Island consumers; and WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that our sister state of Alaska has similar challenges to meeting the needs of its people
26 27 28 29	with regard to air transportation and has recently been granted authority by Congress to regulate air travel in their state to protect the public interest; and
30 31 32 33 34	WHEREAS, given the potential negative impacts of the loss of interisland air carrier competition on consumers, the State of Hawaii should have the authority to regulate air travel to protect the public's interests; now, therefore,
35 36 37 38 39 40 41	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the United States Congress is requested to enact enabling legislation that would permit state regulation of interisland air carriers by an Air Carrier Commission pursuant to Act 332, Session Laws of Hawaii 1993; and
