## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

STRONGLY URGING THE HONOLULU CITY COUNCIL TO RECONSIDER THE SELECTION OF THE SALT LAKE ALIGNMENT AND TO COMMIT TO CONSTRUCTION OF THE FIXED GUIDEWAY SYSTEM ALONG THE AIRPORT/PEARL HARBOR ALIGNMENT.

1 WHEREAS, traffic congestion in Honolulu's east-west 2 corridor is intolerable for many commuters and affecting the 3 quality of life for those who must spend many non-productive 4 hours in traffic; and 5

6 WHEREAS, a planning study conducted by the Oahu 7 Metropolitan Planning Organization (OMPO) concluded that the 8 already overburdened existing transportation infrastructure will 9 not be able to accommodate the level of growth expected over the 10 next 20 years; and

12 WHEREAS, the OMPO study also predicted that the traffic 13 delay will increase 500% by the year 2030 if only the currently 14 planned projects are implemented to improve our streets and 15 highways; and

WHEREAS, the OMPO study further identified that a highspeed, high-capacity transit system in the corridor would be a viable and cost-effective component of the future transportation infrastructure; and

22 WHEREAS, following the OMPO study, the City and County of 23 Honolulu initiated a detailed study to evaluate future transit 24 improvements, specifically a fixed guideway system that is 25 physically separated from the roadway and traffic congestion; 26 and

28 WHEREAS, the federal government requires that the City 29 follow a set of strict evaluation guidelines to analyze the 30 various alternatives under consideration in a fair and



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technically sound manner, and that this process is essential in 1 order to be eligible for future federal transit funds; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the City completed the study last year in strict 4 accordance with federal requirements and presented its findings 5 to the City Council for their policy decision to select the 6 alternative that would best reduce future traffic congestion 7 while providing the opportunity for improving the quality of 8 9 life for Oahu residents and visitors; and 10 WHEREAS, the City Council agreed with the recommendation of 11 Mayor Hannemann's Administration and selected the fixed guideway 12 alternative connecting West Kapolei and the University of Hawaii 13 at Manoa as the best system to address the needs and demands of 14 15 the growing island population; and 16 WHEREAS, immediately following the selection of the fixed 17 quideway as the primary mode to serve the entire east-west 18 corridor of the City, the City Council approved a shorter 19 section to be the first phase that is affordable within 20 available funding and reasonably expected federal funds; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the Twenty-fourth State Legislature appreciates 23 the work and efforts of the City and County of Honolulu and its 24 Council members in having the foresight and vision to address 25 future traffic problems and improve its citizens' quality of 26 life, however, the Legislature and its members are concerned 27 with the City Council's selection of the Salt Lake alignment 28 over the Pearl Harbor/Airport alignment; and 29 30 WHEREAS, the technical analysis clearly indicates that the 31 Pearl Harbor/Airport alignment is superior to the Salt Lake 32 alignment in terms of the coverage of major employment centers, 33 combined number of resident and employment within walking 34 distance of stations, ridership, noise impacts to residents, 35 number of private and federal properties impacted, 36 constructability, and cost effectiveness; now, therefore, 37 38 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 39 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 40 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature 41 strongly urges the Honolulu City Council to reconsider the 42 selection of the Salt Lake alignment and to commit to 43 construction of the fixed guideway system along the 44



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Airport/Pearl Harbor alignment and strongly urges the city to 1 2 prioritize the addition of this alignment as studies are completed and funds are available; and 3

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 5 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor of the City 6 7 and County of Honolulu and the Honolulu City Council. 8
