## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON CREATING A ONE-STOP PERMIT SHOP FOR RENEWABLE ENERGY PROJECTS.

1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that Hawaii's dependency on petroleum is the highest in the nation, accounting for approximately ninety per cent of the State's energy needs; and
5 6 7 8 9 10	WHEREAS, Hawaii's high petroleum dependency makes consumers extremely vulnerable to any disruption of petroleum imports, such as oil embargos, supply disruptions, international market dysfunctions, and many other factors beyond the State's control; and
10 11 12 13 14 15 16	WHEREAS, the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism has committed to energy objectives toward achieving dependable, efficient, and statewide economic energy systems, increased self-sufficiency, greater energy security, and reduction of greenhouse gas emissions; and
10 17 18 19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, Act 272, Session Laws of Hawaii 2001, was enacted to recognize the economic, environmental, and fuel diversity benefits of renewable energy resources and the need to encourage the establishment of a market for renewable energy in Hawaii, using the State's renewable energy resources; and
23 24 25	WHEREAS, Act 240, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, was enacted to provide a framework for energy self-sufficiency; and
23 26 27 28 29 30	WHEREAS, the State has committed to meeting a renewable energy standard that requires twenty per cent of electricity sold in Hawaii to be generated from renewable resources by the end of 2020; and



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WHEREAS, the State has sought also to encourage private 1 2 sector development of renewable energy projects; and 3 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Integrated Energy Policy Report of 1991 4 found that the "permits and approvals that may be required for 5 6 the development and siting of energy facilities can take up to 7 seven years for a single project"; and 8 WHEREAS, renewable energy projects are often complex, 9 large-scale undertakings requiring a number of permits; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes a need to streamline the permit process to provide predictability and to encourage 13 private companies to commit the substantial amounts of capital, 14 time, and effort necessary to develop renewable energy projects; 15 16 and 17 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that the State needs to 18 19 provide further incentives for renewable energy projects, such as grants, tax credits, and other assistance; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that renewable energy projects can provide substantial long-term benefits to the State 23 and that developing renewable energy projects would further 24 state policies of developing indigenous renewable energy 25 resources and decreasing Hawaii's dependency on imported fossil 26 27 fuels; and 28 WHEREAS, the Legislature is committed to advancing projects 29 that support renewable energy technology and that help meet the 30 State's renewable energy portfolio standards; and 31 32 33 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that Hawaii's energy situation provides both challenges and opportunities, that the 34 State may bridge these challenges with opportunities to partner 35 with the private sector, that these projects may need special 36 37 assistance from the State to streamline the permitting process and to provide further incentives toward meeting the State's 38 39 energy objectives of achieving dependable, efficient, and statewide economic energy systems, increased energy self-40 sufficiency, greater energy security, and reduction of 41 greenhouse gas emissions; now, therefore, 42 43

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BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature requests the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to conduct a study of the feasibility of creating a onestop permit shop for renewable energy projects to expedite the permit process; and

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, 10 Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to submit a 11 report with its findings and recommendations, including 12 suggested legislation, to the Legislature not later than twenty 13 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2008; and 14

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and the
Director of the Department of Business, Economic Development,
and Tourism.
