19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that DBEDT is requested to find 20 local products suitable for exportation to Taiwan; and 21

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Secretary of Homeland Security, Director of USCIS, Director of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, Chairperson of the Hawaii Tourism Authority, President of the Hawaii Visitors and Convention Bureau, and Director General of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office.
