## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

AUTHORIZING THE GRANT OF A TERM, NON-EXCLUSIVE EASEMENT COVERING PORTION OF SUBMERGED LANDS AT LAHAINA, MAUI, FOR DIVE SITE FOR COMMERCIAL SUBMARINE TOURS.

WHEREAS, Atlantis Submarines Hawaii, LLC (Atlantis) 1 currently operates a forty-eight-passenger submarine in the Twin 2 Peaks area, consisting of four existing natural reefs (North, 3 South, Keiki, and Lost Vegas); and 4 5 WHEREAS, Atlantis proposed to sink the replica whaling ship 6 Carthaginian to create an artificial reef approximately 3,100 7 feet offshore of Paumana Beach Park and approximately one and 8 one-fourth mile south of Lahaina Harbor. The water depth is 9 approximately one hundred feet deep (sixteen fathoms); and 10 11 WHEREAS, Atlantis believes sinking the Carthaginian to 12 create an artificial reef would (1) alleviate pressure on 13 existing natural reef systems from overuse; (2) promote reef and 14 fish biomass increase for commercial and recreational users, 15 16 divers; and (3) provide educational opportunities to study biomass increase over time; and 17 18 WHEREAS, monitoring surveys by the Department of Land and 19 Natural Resources (Department) have shown that artificial reefs 20 increase species diversity up to five times compared to a barren 21 area, and increase fish biomass up to twenty times compared to a 22 barren area; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the Department believes artificial reefs have been 25 26 successful in increasing the fishing and diving opportunities for residents and visitors of Hawaii; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, Atlantis will not limit public access to the area; 30 and 31

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WHEREAS, the Board of Land and Natural Resources (Board) on 1 September 23, 2005, under agenda item K-2 approved a 2 Conservation District Use Permit; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, on December 9, 2005, under agenda item D-8, the Board authorized the direct issuance of a term, non-exclusive 6 7 easement for the use of state submerged lands, subject to certain terms and conditions; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the Board granted Atlantis a right-of-entry to 10 sink, and Atlantis did sink, the Carthaginian on December 13, 11 2005, because the Board did not want Atlantis to sink the 12 Carthaginian during whale season and there was concern that the 13 Carthaginian would not make it through another winter in Lahaina 14 Harbor; and 15 16 WHEREAS, section 171-53, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires 17 the prior approval of the Governor and prior authorization of 18 the Legislature by concurrent resolution, before submerged 19 public lands may be leased or easements therein granted; now, 20 therefore, 21 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 23 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 24 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Board of Land 25 26 and Natural Resources is hereby authorized to grant a term, nonexclusive easement covering a portion of submerged lands at 27 Lahaina, Maui, for a dive site for commercial submarine tours 28 purposes pursuant to section 171-53, Hawaii Revised Statutes; 29 and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 32 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 33 Board of Land and Natural Resources 34 35 36 OFFERED BY: 37 38 'JAN 2 2 2007

## DEPARTMENT: Land and Natural Resources

- TITLE: CONCURRENT RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE GRANT OF A TERM, NON-EXCLUSIVE EASEMENT COVERING PORTION OF SUBMERGED LANDS AT LAHAINA, MAUI, FOR DIVE SITE FOR COMMERCIAL SUBMARINE TOURS.
- PURPOSE: To seek the prior approval of the Legislature by concurrent resolution to permit the grant of a term, non-exclusive easement for submerged lands at Lahaina, Maui, for dive site for commercial submarine tours purposes.
- MEANS: Concurrent resolution pursuant to section 171-53, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).
- JUSTIFICATION: Atlantis Submarines Hawaii, LLC (Atlantis) currently operates a 48-passenger submarine in the Twin Peaks area, consisting of four (4) existing natural reefs (North, South, Keiki, and Lost Vegas) at Lahaina, Maui.

Atlantis proposed to sink the replica whaling ship Carthaginian to create an artificial reef approximately 3,100 feet offshore of Paumana Beach Park and approximately 1 1/4 mile south of Lahaina Harbor. The water depth is approximately 100 feet deep (16 fathoms).

Atlantis believes sinking the Carthaginian to create an artificial reef would; (1) alleviate pressure on existing natural reef systems from overuse; (2) promote reef and fish biomass increase for commercial and recreational users, divers; and (3) provide educational opportunities to study biomass increase over time.

Artificial reef monitoring surveys by the Department have shown that artificial reefs increase species diversity up to five times

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compared to a barren area, and increase fish biomass up to twenty times compared to a barren area. The Department believes that artificial reefs have been successful in increasing the fishing and diving opportunities for the residents and visitors of Hawaii.

Atlantis will not limit public access to the area.

The Board of Land and Natural Resources (Board) on September 23, 2005, under agenda item K-2 approved a Conservation District Use Permit.

On December 9, 2005, under agenda item D-8, the Board authorized the direct issuance of a term, non-exclusive easement for the use of state submerged lands, subject to certain terms and conditions.

The Board granted Atlantis a right-of-entry to sink, and Atlantis did sink the Carthaginian on December 13, 2005. The Board did not want Atlantis to sink the Carthaginian during whale season and there was concern that the Carthaginian would not make it through another winter in Lahaina Harbor.

This concurrent resolution is requested to allow for the direct grant of a term, nonexclusive easement for submerged lands as required under section 171-53, HRS.

Impact on the public: Alleviate pressure on existing natural reef systems from overuse; promote reef and fish biomass increase for commercial and recreational users, divers; and provide educational opportunities to study biomass increase over time.

Impact on the department and other agencies: Generate additional revenues to the State.
