
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF STATE-PROVINCE
RELATIONS OF FRIENDSHIP BETWEEN THE STATE OF HAWAII OF THE
UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND THE PROVINCE OF THUA THIEN-HUE
OF THE SOCIALIST REPUBLIC OF VIETNAM.

1 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii is actively seeking to expand
2 its international ties and has an abiding interest in developing
3 goodwill, friendship, and economic relations between the people
4 of Hawaii and the people of Asian and Pacific countries; and
5

6 WHEREAS, as part of its effort to achieve this goal, the
7 State has established a number of sister-province agreements
8 with provinces in the Pacific region; and
9

10 WHEREAS, because of the historical relationship between the
11 United States of America and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam,
12 there are compelling reasons to promote international friendship
13 and understanding for the mutual benefit of both countries to
14 achieve lasting peace and prosperity, as this serves the common
15 interests of both countries; and
16

17 WHEREAS, there are historical precedents exemplifying the
18 common desire to maintain a close cultural, commercial, and
19 financial bridge between ethnic Vietnamese living in Hawaii and
20 their relatives, friends, and business counterparts in the
21 Socialist Republic of Vietnam, such as the previously
22 established sister-city relationship between the City and County
23 of Honolulu and the City of Hue, which is the capital of the
24 Province of Thua Thien-Hue; and

26 WHEREAS, a similar state-province relationship between the
27 State and the Province of Thua Thien-Hue, whereby exchanges and
28 cooperation could be established in the areas of business,
29 trade, agriculture, environmentally and culturally sensitive
30 tourism, sports, public health, education, economic development,



1 and humanitarian assistance, would reinforce and cement this
2 common bridge of understanding and mutual assistance between the
3 ethnic Vietnamese of both the State and the Province of Thua
4 Thien-Hue; and

5
6 WHEREAS, the Province of Thua Thien-Hue, like Hawaii, has
7 an agricultural economy that is based upon sugar cane, fruits,
8 and flowers, and aquaculture crops, such as shrimp; and

9
10 WHEREAS, the city of Hue, capital of the Province of Thua
11 Thien-Hue has been designated as a World Heritage Site by the
12 United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural
13 Organization because its cultural and natural properties are
14 considered to be of outstanding universal value and must be
15 protected; and

16
17 WHEREAS, the Province of Thua Thien-Hue's unique cultural
18 and historical significance and natural beauty are important
19 resources on which to base an environmentally and culturally
20 sensitive tourism industry; and

21
22 WHEREAS, Hawaii's long experience and expertise in tourism,
23 agriculture, and aquaculture could be shared with the Province
24 of Thua Thien-Hue; now, therefore,

25
26 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
27 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
28 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Governor of the
29 State of Hawaii, or the Governor's designee, is requested to
30 take all necessary actions to establish a sister-province
31 affiliation with the Province of Thua Thien-Hue in the Socialist
32 Republic of Vietnam; and

34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor is requested to
35 keep the Legislature fully apprised of any progress made in
36 establishing the relationship in order that the Legislature may
37 be involved in its formalization to the extent practicable; and

39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Province of Thua Thien-Hue
40 be afforded the privileges and honors to which Hawaii extends to
41 its other sister-states and provinces; and

43 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
44 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the

1 United States through the Secretary of State, the Governor of
2 the State of Hawaii, the President of the United States Senate,
3 the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives,
4 Hawaii's congressional delegation, the President of the
5 Socialist Republic of Vietnam through its San Francisco
6 Consulate General, the Governor of the Province of Thua Thien-
7 Hue, Socialist Republic of Vietnam, and the Director of
8 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism.
