1 2 3 4 5	WHEREAS, the purpose of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) is to promote the welfare, interests, and development of elementary, secondary, and higher education through:

18 19 20	WHEREAS, WASC is composed of a nine-member board of directors and has three accrediting commissions, as follows:		
21 22 23	(1)	The Accrediting Commission for Senior Colleges and Universities, which is composed of 18-25 members;	
24 25 26 27 28	(2)	The Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges, which is composed of 19 members, one of whom is nominated by the President of the University of Hawaii; and	



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The Accrediting Commission for Schools, which is (3) 1 composed of up to 25 members of whom: 2 3 4 (A) One is nominated by the Hawaii Government Employees' Association; 5 6 One is nominated by the Hawaii Association of 7 (B) 8 Independent Schools; 9 (C) One is a practicing classroom teacher on a 10 rotational basis from the Hawaii, Pacific 11 12 Islands, and East Asia Regional Council of Overseas Schools region; and 13 14 One is a member of the Hawaii Department of 15 (D) Education and has ex-officio status on the 16 Commission; 17 18 and 19 20 WHEREAS, the accrediting region of WASC consists of the 21 states of California and Hawaii, the territories of Guam, 22 American Samoa, Federated States of Micronesia, Republic of the 23 Marshall Islands, Republic of Palau, Commonwealth of the 24 Northern Marianas Islands, Pacific Basin, and East Asia, and 25 areas of the Pacific and East Asia where American/International 26 schools or colleges may apply; and 27 28 WHEREAS, as the only two states in WASC, Hawaii and 29 California equally contribute valuable input to the 30 accreditation of educational institutions at all levels in the 31 Pacific and East Asia regions; and 32 33 WHEREAS, the importance of the tasks performed by WASC 34 should require that the two states be given equal voices, but 35 Hawaii does not have parity with California on WASC's Board of 36 Directors; and 37 38 WHEREAS, although the University of Hawaii has often been 39 referred to as a world-class research university, it has not 40 been included on U.S. News' annual list of top 50 public 41 national universities, which has included seven University of 42 California campuses, and this may be an indicator of unequal 43 44 representation on WASC; now, therefore, HCR HMS 2007-3041
