HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

CONVENING A JOINT TASK FORCE TO REVIEW AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING THE STRUCTURE AND OPERATIONS OF THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION.

1 WHEREAS, Chapter 323F, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), 2 relating to the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation (HHSC), was enacted by Act 262, Session Laws of Hawaii 1996 (Act 262), for 3 the purpose of administering the State's community hospitals; 4 and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, HHSC was envisioned as a new corporate structure that would be freed from unwarranted bureaucratic oversight; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, Act 262 created HHSC to operate the existing community hospitals under a Board of Directors and empowered 11 12 HHSC to perform many functions consistent with those of other public corporations established to operate health care systems 13 14 with relative autonomy; and 15 WHEREAS, Act 229, Session Laws of Hawaii 1998, amended laws 16 concerning HHSC by establishing an Executive Public Health 17 Facility Management Advisory Committee, empowering the chief 18 19 executive officer of HHSC to establish certain exempt management positions, and enabling HHSC to negotiate most terms of 20 collective bargaining agreements; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, over the past ten years, HHSC has been able to achieve substantial improvements in operations and facilities by 24 using the structure and powers provided by statute; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, some members of the management of HHSC, Regional Management Advisory Committees, and HHSC medical staff have 28 recently sought greater autonomy for HHSC regions; and 29



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1 WHEREAS, there has also been heated debate during the 2007 2 legislative session--within and without the Legislature--over 3 whether: 4 The establishment of regional affiliate corporations 5 (1)would create such dysfunction and conflict that it 6 would cause the HHSC system to fail and collapse; and 7 8 9 (2) Regional autonomy can be appropriately provided through regional boards or whether regional autonomy 10 appropriately requires the establishment of separate 11 regional affiliate corporations; 12 13 14 and 15 WHEREAS, leaders of HHSC and the Legislature believe that 16 the arguments must be resolved for HHSC to evolve and improve as 17 a system; now, therefore, 18 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 21 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the President of 22 the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives 23 convene a joint task force (Task Force), consisting of no more 24 than three members from each house, during the interim between 25 the 2007 and 2008 legislative sessions; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the Task Force 28 29 also include: 30 The chair of the Senate Committee on Health or a (1)31 designee; 32 33 (2) The chair of the House Committee on Health or a 34 designee; 35 36 One member from each of the five HHSC Regional (3) 37 Management Advisory Committees; 38 39 (4) One member from the Board of Directors of HHSC; and 40 41 (5) The Director of Health or a designee; 42 43 44 and



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force be exempt from 1 Chapter 92, HRS; and 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force review the 4 concerns raised by the Maui Region Public Health Facility 5 Management Advisory Committee, Executive Public Health 6 Management Advisory Committee, and members of the Board of 7 8 Directors of HHSC; and 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of the State 10 Health Planning and Development Agency (SHPDA) is requested to 11 assist the Task Force in the review of Chapter 323F, HRS; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force submit a report 14 of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed 15 legislation, to the Legislature at least 20 days before the 16 convening of the Regular Session of 2008; and 17 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health, 20 chief executive officer of HHSC, mayor of each county, Director 21 22 of SHPDA, administrator of the State Procurement Office, President of the state Senate, and Speaker of the state House of 23 Representatives. 24
