
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT TO IDENTIFY AND FACILITATE
THE RETURN OF ANY CEDED LANDS NOT BEING USED TO THE STATE
OF HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, following a United States Department of Defense
2 base realignment and closing review, Barbers Point Naval Air
3 Station was closed on July 1, 1999; and
4

5 WHEREAS, the United States Navy conveyed approximately
6 2,150 acres of former base property to various agencies of the
7 State and City and County of Honolulu; and
8

9 WHEREAS, there may be other lands in the State that are
10 controlled by agencies of the federal government that are or
11 could have been classified as ceded lands; and
12

13 WHEREAS, some of these lands may not be in use by various
14 agencies of the federal government and may be deemed surplus
15 lands; now, therefore,
16

17 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
18 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
19 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the United States
20 General Service Administration and the United States Department
21 of Defense are requested to identify and facilitate the return
22 to the State of any ceded lands presently under the control of
23 and not being used by any federal agency; and

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
26 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Administrator of the

2 Defense, and the members of Hawaii's congressional delegation.
