HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DIRECTOR OF HUMAN SERVICES TO FACILITATE PROVISION OF SOCIAL SERVICES TO VICTIMS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING PENDING REPATRIATION OR DETERMINATION OF RESIDENCY STATUS.

WHEREAS, trafficking in persons - the illegal and highly 1 profitable recruitment, transport, or sale of human beings into 2 all forms of forced labor and servitude, including trafficking 3 4 into forced marriage - is a tragic and complex human rights abuse; and 5 6 WHEREAS, women and children are particularly vulnerable to 7 this slavery-like practice, due largely to the persistent 8 inequalities they face in status and opportunity worldwide; and 9 10 WHEREAS, corrupt officials facilitate the trafficking, 11 accepting bribes to falsify documents and provide protection; 12 13 and 14 WHEREAS, many governments treat trafficked persons as 15 illegal aliens, criminals, or both, exposing them to further 16 abuse; and 17 18 WHEREAS, there is a need to curtail this human rights abuse 19 through legal regulations and punitive measures as well as by 20 creating institutional mechanisms for the protection and support 21 of trafficked persons while in the United States, including 22 support in either becoming citizens or repatriation to their 23 home countries; and 24 25 WHEREAS, House Bill No. 1784 makes trafficking of humans a 26 crime with penalties, it does not address the need to find 27 solutions to trafficking, giving in-country support to the 28 victims of this crime while they are in the State of Hawaii by 29



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either assisting these victims to become residents or citizens 1 of Hawaii or by facilitating a return to their home country; and 2 3 WHEREAS, in the Philippines Republic Act 9208, Section 14, 4 the court shall order the confiscation and forfeiture in favor 5 of the government of all the proceeds and properties derived 6 from the commission of the crime and put them into a trust fund 7 which shall be administered by an Inter-Agency Council Against 8 Trafficking for programs that will prevent acts of trafficking 9 and protect, rehabilitate, and reintegrate trafficked persons 10 into the mainstream of society; and 11 12 WHEREAS, trafficked persons in Hawaii who are nationals of 13 a foreign country should also be entitled to appropriate 14 protection, assistance, and services such as legal services, 15 health care, emergency shelters, skills training, and 16 educational assistance to trafficked children; and 17 18 WHEREAS, a single state agency should be designated to take 19 primary responsibility for facilitating the repatriation of 20 trafficked persons unless repatriation would expose the victims 21 to greater risks, in which case this agency should undertake 22 such efforts as may be necessary for the extension of 23 appropriate residency permits and protection, as may be legally 24 permissible in the State of Hawaii; now, therefore, 25 26 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 27 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 28 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Director of 29 Human Services is requested to facilitate the provision of 30 social services by public and private agencies to victims of 31 trafficking until such time as the person secures a visa, 32 certification, or a work authorization card from the Department 33 of Homeland Security or other federal agency or to facilitate 34 the person's return to their country of origin if they wish to 35 do so; and 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 38 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human 39 40 Services. 41 42 43 OFFERED BY: 307.doc

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
