OPPOSING A SPLIT OF THE UNITED STATES COURT OF APPEALS FOR THE NINTH CIRCUIT.

1 2 3 4 5 6	WHEREAS, the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit has appellate jurisdiction over the United States District Courts in Alaska, Arizona, California, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Washington, and the territorial courts of Guam and the Northern Mariana Islands; and
7 8 9 10 11	WHEREAS, since 2002, repeated efforts have been made in both Houses of the United States Congress to pass legislation that would split the Ninth Circuit into two separate Circuit Courts of Appeal; and

No. 4241, and passed by the United States House of Representatives would create a Ninth Circuit covering California, Hawaii, Guam, and the Northern Mariana Islands, and a new Twelfth Circuit covering Alaska, Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, and Arizona; and
18 19 20 21 22 23	WHEREAS, although the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals has the largest caseload of any United States Circuit Court of Appeals, it continues to effectively manage its growing caseload by instituting a variety of administrative efficiencies; and
24 25 26	WHEREAS, dividing the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals would create administrative disruption and additional expense; and
20 27 28 29 30	WHEREAS, an overwhelming majority of the judges on the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals support keeping the appellate circuit intact; and
31 32	WHEREAS, in the absence of proof that the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals is not operating effectively, and in the

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 5 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 6 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the President of 7 8 the United States, the United States Congress, and all the state Legislatures are respectfully urged to oppose a split of the 9 United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit and to keep 10 the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit intact 11 in view of the concerns expressed in this Concurrent Resolution; 12 13 and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 15 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the 16 United States, the Majority Leader of the United States Senate, 17 the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, 18 Hawaii's congressional delegation, and to each of the presiding 19 officers of the legislative bodies of each state. 20
