HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE PRESIDENT OF MEXICO AND THE SECOND DISTRICT COURT OF GUADALAJARA TO DROP EXTRADITION CHARGES AGAINST TV BOUNTY HUNTER, DUANE "DOG" CHAPMAN.

WHEREAS, justice is a determinant of the sovereign 1 political systems of all nations, and international disputes 2 arise when two jurisdictions conflict or fail to agree upon the 3 best course of action; and 4 5 WHEREAS, a present jurisdictional dispute exits between the 6 7 United States and Mexico surrounding the action of Duane "Dog" Chapman who in June 2003 traveled to Mexico to apprehend a 8 convicted American rapist, Andrew Luster, the Max Factor heir; 9 10 and 11 WHEREAS, Luster was a convicted rapist who had fled from 12 California six months earlier by jumping \$1 million bond on 13 charges that he drugged and raped three women; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, Luster's disappearance sparked an international manhunt by police, FBI and bounty hunters trying to recoup some 17 18 of the bond money; and 19 WHEREAS, Mexico has requested extradition of Chapman after 20 charging him with felony kidnapping, and "deprivation of 21 liberty" for the capture and return of Luster to the United 22 23 Sates; and 24 25 WHEREAS, Chapman was arrested in his Hawaii home in September, 2006 by U.S. Marshals and was freed on \$300,000 bail, 26 and has been fighting extradition to Mexico, where if convicted 27 he and his son Leland and Tim Chapman (all of whom were involved 28 29 in the capture of Lester) could be required to spend up to 4 years in a Mexican jail; and 30 31

1 2 WHEREAS, Luster is now serving a 124-year sentence in 3 4 California; and 5 WHEREAS, Duane Chapman has never been paid for Luster's 6 capture, and has offered to apologize to the Mexican government, 7 8 and 9 WHEREAS, Chapman believed he could legally arrest Luster 10 based on the fact that Luster had entered Mexico under a false 11 12 name; now, therefore 13 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 15 16 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the legislature of the state of Hawaii in full support of the plight of Duane "Dog" 17 Chapman requests that the President and Congress of Mexico and 18 the Second District Court of Guadalajara drop charges of 19 extradition and allow this international dispute to be amicably 20 21 solved by virtue of the justice that has been served in the 22 United States against rapist Luster by the brave actions of Hawaii resident, Duane "Dog" Chapman; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 25 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of Mexico, 26 the Second District Court in Guadalajara, Mexico, President 27 George W.
