HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING ALL BRANCHES OF THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT TO PROHIBIT DUMPING OF VESSEL SEWAGE IN FEDERAL WATERS IN THE VICINITY OF THE HAWAIIAN ISLANDS HUMPBACK WHALE NATIONAL MARINE SANCTUARY.

1 WHEREAS, the waters around the islands of Hawaii are 2 enjoyed by residents, tourists, sports enthusiasts, and 3 recreational users, and provide an essential habitat for many 4 kinds of animals, whether birds, fish, or mammals; and 5 WHEREAS, the ocean resources of the State of Hawaii include 6 7 the waters of the Hawaiian Islands Humpback Whale National 8 Marine Sanctuary, created pursuant to the Hawaiian Island 9 National Marine Sanctuary Act, Title II, Subtitle C, Public Law 10 102-587, herein referred to as the "Whale and Marine Sanctuary"; 11 and 12 WHEREAS, the Whale and Marine Sanctuary adjoins portions of 13 14 all of the Hawaiian islands of Kauai, Oahu, Maui, Molokai, Hawaii, and Lanai; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the waters of the Whale and Marine Sanctuary are 17 relatively shallow, calm, protected waters, and are a critical 18 habitat in winter months of the endangered North Pacific 19 humpback whales; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, critically endangered humpback whales breed, calve, and nurse their young in the Whale and Marine Sanctuary; 23 and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, the Whale and Marine Sanctuary provides an 27 important habitat for other endangered and protected species, including green sea turtles, hawksbill sea turtles, monk seals, 28 29 and others; and



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1 WHEREAS, the waters of the Whale and Marine Sanctuary 2 include complex ecosystems of marine life populations and reefs 3 that are fragile and under stress from human activities; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the waters of the Whale and Marine Sanctuary 6 include areas previously designated for preservation of wildlife 7 by the State of Hawaii, including the Molokini Shoal Marine Life and Bird Conservation District, Honolua-Mokule'ia Marine Life 8 9 Conservation District, Manele-Hulopo'e Marine Life Conservation District, Hanauma Bay Marine Life Conservation District, Pupukea 10 11 Marine Life Conservation District, Lapakahi Marine Life Conservation District, Waialea Bay Marine Life Conservation 12 13 District, and the marine portion of the 'Ahihi-Kina'u Natural Area Reserve; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the economy of Hawaii benefits from the tourism 16 industry that, in turn, relies upon the ocean's resources, 17 including the waters within the Whale and Marine Sanctuary; and 18 19 WHEREAS, residents and tourists alike enjoy the resources 20 located within the Whale and Marine Sanctuary in a variety of 21 ways, including snorkeling, diving, fishing, kayaking, canoeing, 22 and wildlife observation tours; and 23 24 WHEREAS, human activities in the waters surrounding Hawaii 25 and in particular within the Whale and Marine Sanctuary have 26 27 increased dramatically in recent years; and 28 29 WHEREAS, governmental agencies have received an increasing number of complaints from Hawaii residents and from tourists 30 about tour boat operators' practice of dumping concentrated 31 32 human sewage into the waters surrounding Hawaii and in 33 particular into the waters within the Whale and Marine 34 Sanctuary; and 35 WHEREAS, the County of Maui has declared, by Council 36 Resolution adopted February, 2006, that "...it is imperative 37 that dumping of raw sewage and chemical contaminants into our 38 39 ocean cease immediately, and that our precious marine ecosystem, 40 which our residents and tourism industry cherish and depend on, be protected..."; and 41



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1 WHEREAS, the County of Maui has taken the initiative in this problem and provided funds for vessel operators to be 2 reimbursed for pumping sewage contents at Ma'alaea Harbor via 3 4 mobile pump trucks that haul away the sewage for land-based treatment; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, other governmental agencies have pledged additional funds for mobile dock-side pump trucks to haul vessel 8 9 sewage to land-based treatment facilities; and 10 11 WHEREAS, mobile dock-side pump trucks are available at 12 other harbors within Maui and Hawaii counties; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii has provided permanent landbased sewage treatment facilities at certain harbors; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii has prohibited the dumping of 18 most vessel sewage within state waters; and 19 WHEREAS, the United States government can and should 20 21 prohibit dumping sewage into federal waters in the vicinity of the islands of Hawaii and particularly into the waters of the 22 23 Whale and Marine Sanctuary by creating a no-discharge zone, pursuant to the Clean Water Act, 33 United States Code section 24 25 1251 et seq. and by adopting appropriate rules pursuant to 16 United States Code section 1431 et seq.; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, residents of Hawaii have requested a no-discharge 29 zone for the waters of the Whale and Marine Sanctuary and were 30 informed that pursuant to the Clean Water Act, the United States Congress is required to receive a request for a no-discharge 31 zone from the State of Hawaii in order for the Environmental 32 33 Protection Agency to create a no-discharge zone for federal waters; and 34 35 36 WHEREAS, the Environmental Protection Agency is requested to consider an application for a no-discharge zone from the 37 38 State of Hawaii if made pursuant to the Clean Water Act; and 39 40 WHEREAS, residents of Hawaii have requested that laws and 41 rules designed to prohibit the dumping of sewage by tour vessels 42 within state waters, federal waters in the vicinity of the Hawaiian islands, and in particular within the Whale and Marine 43



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Sanctuary, be enacted and adopted, and specific laws and rules
have not been instituted; and

3 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii's representative serves as4 co-manager of the Whale and Marine Sanctuary; and

6 WHEREAS, the United States Department of Commerce is the 7 federal agency responsible for the administration of the Whale 8 and Marine Sanctuary, and the Environmental Protection Agency is 9 the federal agency responsible for administration of the Clean 10 Water Act; and

12 WHEREAS, the sewage dumped in federal waters in the 13 vicinity of the Hawaiian islands and in particular within the 14 Whale and Marine Sanctuary impacts the health, welfare, and 15 enjoyment of Hawaii residents and visitors; now, therefore, 16

17 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 18 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the United States 19 Congress is respectfully requested to prohibit the dumping of 20 vessel sewage in federal waters in the vicinity of the island of 21 Hawaii and especially within the boundaries of the Hawaiian 22 Islands Humpback Whale National Marine Sanctuary, by creation of 23 a no-discharge zone pursuant to the Clean Water Act, 33 United 24 States Code section 1251 et seq., and by requiring appropriate 25 26 federal executive agencies to adopt necessary regulations pursuant to 16 United States Code section 1431 et seq. to ensure 27 28 proper administration, management, and enforcement of applicable 29 laws; and

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
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31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Department of Land 32 and Natural Resources and other state agencies and personnel, including the Hawaii co-manager of the Hawaiian Islands Humpback 33 Whale National Marine Sanctuary, are requested to cooperate, 34 assist, and encourage efforts to prohibit dumping of vessel 35 sewage into federal waters in the vicinity of the islands of 36 Hawaii and the Hawaiian Islands Humpback Whale National Marine 37 38 Sanctuary; and

40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Division of Boating and 41 Ocean Recreation of the Department of Land and Natural Resources 42 is requested to develop a plan to implement so called "pump-43 don't dump" stations, where mobile pump trucks pump sewage from





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1 vessels and transport the sewage to land-based sewage treatment 2 facilities; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation is requested to submit a report of its findings 5 and recommendations, including suggested legislation, to the 6 Legislature no later than 20 days prior to the convening of the 7 Regular Session of 2008; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 10 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Majority Leader of 11 12 the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States of House of Representatives, the United States Secretary of 13 14 Commerce, the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency, the members of Hawaii's Congressional delegation, the 15 co-managers of the Hawaiian Islands Humpback Whale National 16 Marine Sanctuary, the Governor, and the Chairperson of the Board 17 18 of Land and Natural Resources.
