HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO PROCLAIM JULY 18, 2007, AS SHARON MABE DAY IN THE STATE OF HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, a fundamental part of our culture of aloha 2 includes honoring our elders and teaching future generations to 3 study and learn from the devotion, dedication, deeds, and 4 sacrifices of those who helped build our community and State; 5 and 6

WHEREAS, during the Regular Session of 2006, the House of 7 Representatives of the 23rd Legislature of the State of Hawaii 8 presented Sharon Mabe, a life-long Oahu resident, with a 9 congratulatory certificate upon her retirement after nearly 35 10 years of employment with the United States Department of 11 12 Defense, having served throughout the duration of the Cold War and into the modern era in critical posts at both Fort Shafter 13 and Hickam Air Force Base; and 14

16 WHEREAS, Sharon Mabe contributed to the continued defense17 and security of not only the islands of Hawaii, but the entire18 United States of America; and

20 WHEREAS, despite being diagnosed with cancer and suffering 21 greatly on a daily basis, Sharon Mabe continued for years in her 22 civil service employment with the United States Pacific Air 23 Forces (PACAF) assignments branch at Hickam Air Force Base; and 24

WHEREAS, within less than three months of retirement and
being honored by the 23rd Legislature with a congratulatory
certificate for her devoted service, Sharon Mabe died of cancer,
survived by her husband and daughter; and

1 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that the loss of a 2 person who devoted their entire life to public service is a humbling reminder of the stresses, pressures, and strain that 3 often accompanies the responsibilities of serving the people; 4 and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, the Legislature is both humbled by and thankful for the efforts of island residents such as Sharon Mabe and 8 recognizes that there are many more like her who continue to 9 serve selflessly; and 10 11 WHEREAS, Sharon Mabe's service to our State and nation are 12 fully in keeping with our state motto, which proclaims, "Ua mau 13 ke ea o ka aina i ka pono", which is interpreted as "The life of 14 the land is perpetuated in righteousness"; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the founders of these islands, who braved great 17 danger, difficulty, and uncertainty to create a nation of 18 19 righteousness, would be proud of persons such as Sharon Mabe; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, future generations of our keiki would do well to learn from the example of persons like Sharon Mabe; and 23 24 WHEREAS, it is not uncommon to recognize persons of 25 exceptional, conspicuous merit and hold their deeds in 26 27 remembrance by naming certain days in their honor; now, therefore, 28 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 31 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Governor is 32 respectfully requested to proclaim July 18, 2007, as Sharon Mabe 33 Day in the State of Hawaii, commemorating not only the life of 34 35 Sharon Mabe, but also the memory of the thousands of Hawaii residents who have struggled with and died of cancer; and 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature urges 38 scientists, researchers, and physicians around the world to 39 continue their aggressive pursuit for a cure for the terrible 40 41 disease of cancer; and
