## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

## URGING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TO DEVELOP A PHYSICAL THERAPY AND OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY DEGREE PROGRAM WITHIN THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, occupational therapists and physical therapists 1 help individuals improve their health, well-being, and overall 2 lives through treatments that aid individuals in engaging in 3 everyday activities and rehabilitating from ailments or 4 injuries; and 5 6 WHEREAS, occupational therapy helps people of all ages 7 address challenges that impair their ability to perform daily 8 life tasks, which can be physical, developmental, emotional, or 9 cognitive related to a traumatic brain injury or a stroke; and 10 11 WHEREAS, an occupational therapist can help a client gain 12 greater self-awareness through daily occupations and facilitate 13 14 a client's ability to create and engage in daily activities, which gives meaning to the person's life; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, physical therapy treatment can span a wide range of ailments, including such areas as pediatrics, geriatrics, 18 orthopedics, sports medicine, neurology, and cardiopulmonary 19 physical therapy; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, a physical therapist conducts tests and develops treatment strategies to restore function, improve mobility, 23 relieve pain, and prevent or limit permanent physical 24 disabilities of patients suffering from injuries or diseases; 25 26 and 27 WHEREAS, occupational therapy is closely related to 28 physical therapy; and 29 30 WHEREAS, physical therapists and occupational therapists 31 often consult with each other, as well as other professionals, 32

including physicians, dentists, nurses, educators, social 1 workers, speech-language pathologists, and audiologists; and 2 3 WHEREAS, when one experiences physical or mental illness or 4 5 injury, it is the job of the occupational therapist or physical therapist to help the individual return to work, family roles, 6 and satisfying life; and 7 8 WHEREAS, demand for occupational therapy will increase to 9 10 address the needs of a growing population of aging adults, children with developmental disabilities, and those who struggle 11 with traumatic injuries and illnesses; and 12 13 WHEREAS, additionally, widespread interest in the promotion 14 of health and healthy lifestyles, as well as the number of 15 individuals requiring therapy services, due in part to an aging 16 population, demand for physical therapy and qualified physical 17 therapists will continue to increase over the next several 18 years; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, although the University of Hawaii at Manoa currently supports a degree program in Kinesiology and Leisure 22 Science, which has been designed to allow students to fulfill 23 the requirements for entry into graduate programs in the area of 24 allied health sciences, including physical therapy and 25 occupational therapy, no separate degree program for either 26 occupational therapy or physical therapy exists at any 27 University of Hawaii campus; now, therefore, 28 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 31 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the University of 32 Hawaii is urged to establish a School of Physical Therapy and 33 34 Occupational Therapy within the University of Hawaii System; and 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the programs may be established as separate schools or combined into one school, as deemed 37 appropriate by the University of Hawaii; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the University of Hawaii 40 present a report on the formation or reasons for not forming a 41 42 School of Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy to the Legislature twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular 43 Session of 2008; and 44 2007-2172 HCR SMA.doc
