## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

PROCLAIMING APRIL 30 OF EVERY YEAR AS HAWAIIAN RESTORATION DAY.

WHEREAS, in 1991, the General Synod of the United Churches 1 2 of Christ, representing over six thousand member churches, passed a resolution "Recognizing the Rights of Native Hawaiians 3 to Self-Governance and Self-Determination"; and 4 5 WHEREAS, in 1993, the President of the United Church of 6 Christ, which sent the first missionaries to Hawaii in 1820, 7 issued a formal "Apology to Na Kanaka Maoli" and committed the 8 church to redress the wrongs done to native Hawaiians; and 9 10 WHEREAS, in 1993, the United States Congress adopted Public 11 Law 103-50 often referred to as the "Apology Bill," which 12 apologized to native Hawaiians for the illegal overthrow of 13 Queen Liliuokalani and the Hawaiian Kingdom, which was signed by 14 President William J. Clinton; and 15 16 WHEREAS, in 1994, the National Council of Churches USA at 17 18 its General Assembly of sixty-eight denominations passed a resolution titled "A Stolen Nation" that called for support of 19 grass roots efforts of the Kanaka Maoli toward sovereignty and 20 self-determination; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, in the nineteenth century, through a combination of intrigue, subterfuge, betrayal, and incomparable alliances, 24 the sons of the missionaries took control of the lands of Hawaii 25 and seized and operated sugar and pineapple plantations, which 26 became a thriving export business; and 27 28 WHEREAS, in 1872, the United States sent its emissary, 29 General John Schofield, to Hawaii to study the coastline, 30 waterways, bays, and harbors as a civilian; and 31 32



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WHEREAS, in 1881, Secretary of State James Gillespie Blaine 1 told President Benjamin Harrison that Hawaii was of enough value 2 to be annexed to the United States; and 3 4 WHEREAS, in May 1882, Lorrin Thurston of the secret 5 Annexation Club met with President Benjamin Harrison requesting 6 7 assistance with an overthrow of the Hawaiian Kingdom; and 8 9 WHEREAS, B.F. Tracy, Secretary of the Navy, told Thurston, as authorized by the President that "if conditions in Hawaii 10 compel you people to act as you have indicated, and you come to 11 12 Washington with an annexation proposition, you will find an exceedingly sympathetic administration here"; and 13 14 WHEREAS, in November 1892, Secretary of State John W. 15 Foster wrote to Thurston, stating that the Harrison 16 administration was willing to put up \$250,000 to buy out Queen 17 Liliuokalani's claims to Hawaii; and 18 19 WHEREAS, in January 1893, after years of conspiracy and 20 deception, with the aid and support of the United States, the 21 sons of the American missionaries and other business people, 22 planned and executed the illegal overthrow of the Hawaiian 23 Kingdom; and 24 25 WHEREAS, Queen Liliuokalani was the last reigning monarch 26 of the Hawaiian Kingdom; and 27 28 WHEREAS, Queen Liliuokalani, who would not shed one drop of 29 her people's blood to save her nation, was deposed by the 30 advocates of a Republic for Hawaii in 1893; and 31 32 WHEREAS, Grover Cleveland was both the twenty-second and 33 the twenty-fourth president of the United States (1885-1889 and 34 35 1893-1897); and 36 WHEREAS, Cleveland, a distinguished leader, rose to 37 political prominence through the ranks of Mayor of Buffalo and 38 Governor of New York before his election to this nation's 39 highest office; and 40 41 WHEREAS, in March 1893, Grover Cleveland was sworn into 42 43 office for his final term as President, three months after the illegal overthrow of the Hawaiian Kingdom; and 44





1 2 WHEREAS, after President Cleveland, an anti-imperialist, assumed the presidency, he immediately worked to stop the treaty 3 4 of annexation of Hawaii; and 5 WHEREAS, the newly sworn President Cleveland challenged the 6 illegal overthrow of Queen Liliuokalani and sent James Blount to 7 Hawaii to gather facts and to assist in a just determination of 8 9 the involvement of the United States in the overthrow; and 10 WHEREAS, upon the counsel of James Blount and Gresham, 11 12 President Grover Cleveland determined that the United States was unjustly and illegally involved in the overthrow; and 13 14 WHEREAS, President Grover Cleveland addressed the United 15 States Congress and requested that Queen Liliuokalani and the 16 Hawaiian Kingdom be restored; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, always concerned about the underprivileged, 20 Cleveland believed his ultimate allegiance was to the nation, not to a political party, and he acted on his strongly held 21 beliefs throughout his entire political life; and 22 23 WHEREAS, this position by President Cleveland reflected his 24 understanding that imperialism and expansionism were not the 25 unanimously favored policy; and 26 27 WHEREAS, President Cleveland was a very spiritual and moral 28 leader who risked his personal reputation and suffered ridicule 29 30 as a result of the unpopular positions he took; and 31 WHEREAS, President Cleveland faced not only tremendously 32 challenging political, social, and economic circumstances during 33 his terms of office, but he was also battling cancer and 34 35 suffering from ill-health during his last term of office; and 36 WHEREAS, Cleveland spent his last years as a lecturer and 37 beloved member of the administration at Princeton University; 38 and 39 40 41 WHEREAS, in 1898, John Schofield, retired commanding General of the United States Army, reported to the United States 42 43 Congress that the port of Pu'uloa - later to become Pearl Harbor





- was the best natural harbor in the world for the purposes of a 1 modern Navy; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, General Schofield told Congress "...we made a pre-emption which nobody in the world thinks of disputing 5 provided we perfect our title"; and 6 7 WHEREAS, President Grover Cleveland was a true friend to 8 Oueen Liliuokalani and the people of the Hawaiian Kingdom; and 9 10 WHEREAS, today, many people worldwide are recognizing that 11 the spiritual and moral leadership of President Cleveland was 12 ahead of his time; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the people of Hawaii have been supported and 15 encouraged in the last one hundred fourteen years by the words 16 and prayers of President Grover Cleveland; and 17 18 WHEREAS, President Cleveland's legacy and his vision for 19 justice in Hawaii remain strong in Hawaii with the ancestors and 20 people of the Queen; and 21 22 WHEREAS, in a proclamation dated February 25, 1894, 23 President Cleveland declared that "April 30 [of every year] be 24 set aside as a day of solemn fasting, and prayer for the 25 injustice to me [President Grover Cleveland] and my great good 26 sister [Queen Liliuokalani] for her speedy return to the 27 throne"; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the Pacific Justice and Reconciliation Center, the 30 Hawaii Conference of the United Churches of Christ, and the 31 United Church of Christ have worked to lift up the life of 32 President Grover Cleveland, and bring to light the truth of 33 history; now, therefore, 34 35 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 36 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 37 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature and 38 the Governor are requested to recognize and acknowledge the 39 historical and educational contributions of President 40 Cleveland's work for the people of Hawaii and America today and 41 for the future; and 42 43





BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature hereby proclaims April 30 of each year as a special day of remembrance, education, and prayer, for people of all faiths, for Grover Cleveland, a great American who stood for the true values and principles of the United States Constitution, and for "liberty and justice for all"; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 8 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the Mayors 9 of the respective counties of Hawaii, to the Governor of the 10 State of New Jersey, the President of the New Jersey Senate, the 11 Speaker of the New Jersey General Assembly, the Mayor and the 12 Princeton Township Committee, the Mayor of Caldwell, New Jersey 13 and the Council of the Borough of Caldwell, and to the General 14 Minister and President of the United Church of Christ 15 Headquarters. 16
