HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING ENDORSEMENT OF THE EARTH CHARTER AND ADOPTION OF ITS CENTRAL PRINCIPLES AS PART OF THE FRAMEWORK FOR SUSTAINABLE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT.

WHEREAS, the World Commission on Environment and 1 Development (a/k/a "the Brundtland Commission") first called for 2 "a universal declaration" and "new charter" to set "new norms" 3 to guide the transition to sustainable development in the mid-4 1980s; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, discussions led to a draft Earth Charter which was discussed at the Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro in 1992; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, an independent Earth Charter Commission was formed in 1997 to pull together several ongoing international 11 discussions and reach a global consensus on the Earth Charter; 12 13 and 14 15 WHEREAS, the Earth Charter is an authoritative synthesis of values, principles, and aspirations that are widely shared by 16 growing numbers of people, in all regions of the world; and 17 18 WHEREAS, the four central principles of the Earth Charter 19 20 are: Respect and Care for the Community of Life; Ecological Integrity; Social and Economic Justice; Democracy, Nonviolence 21 and Peace; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the Earth Charter is now being used as a basis for 24 peace negotiations, as a reference document in the development 25 of global standards and codes of ethics, as resource for 26 governance and legislative processes, as a community development 27 tool, as an educational framework for sustainable development, 28 and in many other contexts; and 29 30





WHEREAS, the Earth Charter is increasingly recognized as a 1 2 global consensus statement on the meaning of sustainability, the challenge and vision of sustainable development, and the 3 4 principles by which sustainable development is to be achieved; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the Earth Charter's principles of respect, 7 conservation, sustainability, sharing, equality, democracy, 8 tolerance, justice, and peace are consistent with the 9 recommendations of the Hawaii 2050 Sustainability Task Force; 10 and 11 12 WHEREAS, individuals, organizations, and governments 13 worldwide are being urged to endorse the Earth Charter; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii seeks to be a leader in 16 incorporating principles of sustainability into planning 17 processes at all levels of government; now, therefore, 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 20 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 21 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the State of Hawaii 22 endorses the Earth Charter as part of a framework for 23 sustainable planning and development; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor, the mayors and 26 27 county councils, and the Hawaii 2050 Sustainability Task Force are urged to adopt and utilize the Earth Charter as part of a 28 framework for sustainable planning; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 31 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the Mayor 32 and the Chairperson of the Council of each county, Hawaii's 33 congressional delegation, the Hawaii 2050 Sustainability Task 34 35 Force, and Earth Charter USA. 36 37 Jala B.
