HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO EVALUATE THE PRACTICALITY OF HAVING A RESTRUCTURED ACCREDITATION PROCESS FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN THE STATE OF HAWAII.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, thirty per cent of Hawaii public high school graduates require serious remedial work when they arrive on college campuses; and
4 5 6 7 8	WHEREAS, even our best public high school graduates rank twentieth on international tests against the best students of other industrialized nations; and
9 10 11 12	WHEREAS, historically, the only public high school model that can be accredited for state funding in Hawaii is based on the work of John Dewey and William Harris, who used a Prussian military training manual as a base; and
13 14 15 16 17	WHEREAS, time segmentation, age grouping, and the use of bells and whistles in Hawaii high schools is centered on the belief that all courses and methods should be planned without regard to the individual students we serve; and
18 19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, public school teachers and administrators in Hawaii should have a choice of accrediting methods, whether a top-down model or a student-first model, with both models recognized by the State for funding purposes; and
23 24 25 26 27 28	WHEREAS, the International Association of Schools and Colleges accredits schools based on a system that starts with the student as an individual and builds curriculum around each student's aptitudes, interests, learning style, skill levels and emotional maturity; and
29 30 31	WHEREAS, accreditation through a system similar to the International Association of Schools and Colleges model would



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provide the best, logical step to really engage our children in 1 their own education; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, authorizing the use of this accreditation method for our public schools is practical, and would not require 5 additional money or new facilities; now, therefore, 6 7 8 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 9 Session of 2007, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 10 Education is requested to evaluate the practicality of having a 11 12 restructured accreditation process for public schools in Hawaii, using a model similar to the International Association of 13 Schools and Colleges; and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent of Education 16 is requested to submit a report of the Department's findings and 17 recommendations to the Legislature no later than twenty days 18 before the convening of the Regular Session of 2008; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 21 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of 22 Education, and the Chairperson of the Board of Education. 23 24 25 26 OFFERED BY:
