HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS NATION-BUILDING PLAN, HO'OULU LĀHUI ALOHA, TO RAISE A BELOVED NATION.

WHEREAS, the Office of Hawaiian Affairs was created by delegates to the Constitutional Convention of Hawaii of 1978 to right the wrongs suffered by the indigenous people of the Hawaiian Islands; and
WHEREAS, delegates to the Constitutional Convention proposed a constitutional amendment to establish the Office of Hawaiian Affairs as a public trust, with the mandate to better the conditions of Native Hawaiians and the Hawaiian community ir general; and
WHEREAS, through Act 196, Session Laws of Hawaii 1979, codified as chapter 10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Office of Hawaiian Affairs was established as a semi-autonomous "self- governing body"; and
WHEREAS, the Office of Hawaiian Affairs is the sole representative of the Hawaiian community with financial resources that include a public trust and state funds to assist Native Hawaiians and improve the conditions of the Hawaiian community; and
WHEREAS, programs and services benefiting Native Hawaiians are now in jeopardy because of legal challenges, as the number of lawsuits filed has increased ten-fold and plaintiffs have been persistent in advancing their cases; and
WHEREAS, funding for programs, services, and entitlements that benefit and improve the lives of Native Hawaiians are now in danger of being reduced or eliminated; and



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WHEREAS, the Native Hawaiian Government Reorganization Act 1 2 of 2007, S. 310 in the United States Senate and H.R. 505 in the United States House of Representatives, also known as the "Akaka 3 Bill" has not received a full discussion and vote in Congress; 4 5 and 6 7 WHEREAS, the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, with participation 8 from the Native Hawaiian community, is spearheading the creation of a Native Hawaiian governing entity that is recognized by the 9 10 State of Hawaii and the United States government; and 11 WHEREAS, the Office of Hawaiian Affairs created a formal 12 13 document, The Nation-Building Plan to Establish a Native Hawaiian Governing Entity, with participation from the Native 14 Hawaiian community and the State of Hawaii to enable Native 15 Hawaiians to preside over their own resources and assets and 16 determine their own future; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the nation-building plan is being underwritten by 20 the Office of Hawaiian Affairs and includes the following 21 components: 22 23 (1)Registration of Native Hawaiians in Kau Inoa, a campaign that gathers the names of people of Hawaiian 24 ancestry who are willing to participate in the process 25 of nation building; 26 27 (2) 28 Development of an apportionment plan of representative 29 districts based on the eligible voter population; 30 31 (3) Election of representative delegates who will attend a 32 constitutional convention: 33 34 (4) Convening of a constitutional convention to create 35 organic documents of the Native Hawaiian governing entity; and 36 37 (5) 38 Ratification of the organic documents and its articles; 39 40 41 WHEREAS, the ratified organic documents and its articles 42 will form the Native Hawaiian governing entity; now, therefore, 43
