## HOUSE RESOLUTION

---

REQUESTING THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO CONDUCT A  
FEASIBILITY STUDY TO ADDRESS MAJOR CONCERNS ALONG KALIHI  
STREET.

1 WHEREAS, in recent years, the poor condition of Honolulu's  
2 streets has been widely criticized; and  
3

4 WHEREAS, streets have fallen into a state of disrepair,  
5 thereby creating anguish for drivers and sometimes causing  
6 damage to their vehicles; and  
7

8 WHEREAS, while the City and County of Honolulu has taken  
9 great strides to clear the backlog of much-needed street repairs  
10 and repaving, some areas are still in need of remedial  
11 attention; and  
12

13 WHEREAS, one of these areas is Kalihi, where numerous side  
14 streets are in need of repair and repaving; now, therefore,  
15

16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
17 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular  
18 Session of 2007, that the City and County of Honolulu is  
19 requested to conduct a feasibility study to address major  
20 concerns along Kalihi Street; and  
21

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the feasibility study focus  
23 specifically on:  
24

- 25 (1) Widening, through eminent domain, Kalihi Street,  
26 beginning from Kalihi Uka Elementary School to Kalihi  
27 Valley Park at the end of Kalihi Valley;  
28
- 29 (2) Construction of sidewalks along the section of Kalihi  
30 Street described in item (1); and  
31
- 32 (3) Removing telephone poles along the section of Kalihi  
33 Street described in item (1) and, instead, placing  
34 electrical and telecommunications wires underground;




