HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO SUPPORT LEGISLATION AUTHORIZING THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO NEGOTIATE LOWER DRUG PRICES ON BEHALF OF MEDICARE BENEFICIARIES.

1 WHEREAS, data provided by AARP Hawaii shows that half of 2 all people in Hawaii, particularly those ages 50 and older and 3 those with lower incomes, are concerned about being able to 4 afford prescription drugs; and

6 WHEREAS, slightly over half of Hawaii's residents who are
7 taking prescription medication on a regular basis say that
8 paying for their drugs presents a financial burden; and

10 WHEREAS, nearly one-third of our residents who regularly 11 take prescription drugs report taking at least one significant 12 cost-reducing measure to pay for their medication; and 13

WHEREAS, the United States Congress has the opportunity to 14 15 help reduce the cost of prescription drugs for Hawaii's 155,000 enrolled Medicare Part D beneficiaries by strengthening the 16 Medicare Modernization Act of 2003 (MMA) through supporting 17 legislation to give the Secretary of Health and Human Services 18 the authority to use the bargaining power of 43 million Medicare 19 beneficiaries to help make prescription drugs more affordable; 20 and 21

WHEREAS, Hawaii families are counting on Congress to do
everything possible to help make prescription drugs more
affordable and accessible to beneficiaries under the MMA; now,
therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, that the Legislature urges the United States Congress to support legislation authorizing the Secretary of Health and Human Services to negotiate lower drug prices on behalf of Medicare beneficiaries; and
