HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE STATE TO OBSERVE DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME.

WHEREAS, the main purpose of Daylight Saving Time is to 1 make better use of daylight by creating longer summer evenings; 2 3 and 4 5 WHEREAS, historically, Daylight Saving Time was conceived as a means to reduce the use of fuel for lighting, especially in 6 7 times where the use of fuel was necessary for other pressing matters, such as during World War I and World War II; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, studies conducted by the U.S. Department of Transportation show that Daylight Savings Time reduces the 11 entire country's electricity usage by a small, but significant, 12 amount due to less demand for lighting and appliances during the 13 longer daylight hours; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the new federal law coming into effect this year 16 would push the end of Daylight Savings Time to the first Sunday 17 in November; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, observing Daylight Saving Time under the new federal law would provide some interesting benefits, including: 21 providing young trick or treaters with more light, and 22 therefore, more safety from traffic accidents on Halloween; the 23 possibility of increased voter turnout in future general 24 elections as in some future years, the end of Daylight Saving 25 Time will fall after the election day; less violent crime, as a 26 study by the U.S. Law Enforcement Assistance Administration 27 28 found that crime rates were consistently lower during periods of Daylight Saving Time by as much as ten to thirteen percent; and 29 30 31 WHEREAS, perhaps the most important reason for observing Daylight Saving Time, but admittedly the hardest to measure, is 32 33 the potential for working parents to be able to spend more time

with their children after work as opposed to missing out on 1 2 raising their children due to work schedules; now, therefore, 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 5 Session of 2007, that this body requests the Legislative 6 7 Reference Bureau to study the viability of the state observing Daylight Saving Time; and 8 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to report the results of the study and 11 suggested legislation, if any, to the House of Representatives 12 no later than twenty days prior to the opening of the 2008 13 Regular Session; and 14 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 17 Resolution be transmitted to the Legislative Reference Bureau. 18 19 20 OFFERED BY: Colle
