## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO STUDY THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CASH AND COUNSELING PROGRAM IN OTHER STATES.

WHEREAS, Cash and Counseling is a national program 1 sponsored by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the Office of 2 the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation at the 3 United States Department of Health and Human Services, and the 4 Administration on Aging; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, under the program, recipients of Medicaid personal care services or home- and community-based services receive a 8 flexible monthly allowance and decide who to hire and what 9 10 services they want to receive; and 11 WHEREAS, the program's innovative approach enables 12 participants to direct and manage their personal assistance 13 services according to their own specific needs; and 14 15 WHEREAS, participants receive counseling and fiscal 16 assistance to help them manage their allowance and 17 responsibilities; and 18 19 WHEREAS, participants can choose a family member or friend, 20 in lieu of an agency worker, to provide the services; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the program was first implemented in Arkansas, New 23 Jersey, and Florida, and has since expanded to include twelve 24 other states; and 25 26 WHEREAS, the potential exists to establish a similar Cash 27 and Counseling program here in Hawaii to serve the needs of 28 residents receiving Medicaid personal care services or home- and 29 community-based services; and 30 31 WHEREAS, a study of the Cash and Counseling program and its 32 implementation in the other states would be useful in 33 establishing a similar program here in Hawaii; now, therefore, 34 35
