HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING A STUDY ON THE FEASIBILITY OF AN OPEN ROAD RACING EVENT ON OAHU.

WHEREAS, there is substantial interest in holding open road 1 racing events for motor vehicles on the island of Oahu; and 2 3 WHEREAS, open road racing is a high speed race driven on 4 closed public highways; competitors attempt to set certain 5 speeds on a course of pre-determined length and to outrun each 6 other for the victory; and 7 8 WHEREAS, in Nevada, where open road racing is legal, there 9 are strict rules and requirements for each open road race; for 10 example, at the Silver State Classic Challenge each class of 11 cars specifies the safety equipment levels required for cars, 12 drivers, navigators, and a maximum speed, which may not be 13 exceeded for each individual class; and 14 15 WHEREAS, there is a strong auto racing culture in many 16 countries, in the United States, and particularly in California; 17 and 18 19 WHEREAS, to avoid illegal open road racing that often 20 21 endangers the public, legal open road racing events in strictly controlled environments may provide a safe alternative 22 acceptable to drivers, fans, and the public; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that an objective, reasoned 25 examination of issues relating to open road racing would assist 26 members in resolving this matter; now, therefore, 27 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 30 Session of 2007, that the City and County of Honolulu Department 31 of Transportation Services and the state Department of 32 Transportation are requested to conduct a study on the 33 feasibility of holding open road racing events; and 34 35
