## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE SPARK M. MATSUNAGA INSTITUTE FOR PEACE, LOCATED WITHIN THE CENTER FOR POLICY STUDIES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AT MANOA, TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO EXPLORE THE POSSIBILITY OF DESIGNATING HAWAII AS THE "GENEVA OF THE PACIFIC".

1 WHEREAS, Geneva is internationally recognized as a center 2 for conflict resolution, a site for international peace efforts, 3 a convenient location for conferences and conventions, and the 4 headquarters of the International Committee of the Red Cross; 5 and

7 WHEREAS, Geneva shares many connections with Hawaii, 8 including the fact that the missionaries who settled in Hawaii 9 were the descendents of the original Calvinist pilgrims who 10 arrived in the New World on the Mayflower, espousing the 16<sup>th</sup> 11 century creed of Jean Calvin of Switzerland; and 12

13 WHEREAS, Geneva, like Hawaii, is a forward-looking, 14 generous, international city with a global persona and multi-15 national perspectives in which numerous countries have a 16 Consulate General; and

18 WHEREAS, there are presently six career Consulates General 19 and 34 Consulates in Honolulu, representing 40 nations; and 20

21 WHEREAS, Hawaii has maintained a diplomatic and consular 22 network of 93 diplomatic posts around the world and legations 23 from France, Great Britain, Japan, Portugal, and the United 24 States, as well as 20 Consulates, that existed in Honolulu in 25 1892; and

27 WHEREAS, in the mid 19<sup>th</sup> century, Hawaii was the first non28 Western nation to be accepted into the Family of Nations, a
29 consortium of 45 fully independent nations; and

WHEREAS, Hawaii was the leader of the Pacific in the 19<sup>th</sup> 1 century and had diplomatic representation in the series of 2 British colonies that now comprise Australia; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Hawaii has always been internationally oriented, 5 with King Kalakaua, the first head of State, to go around the 6 world while in office in 1881 to establish diplomatic relations; 7 8 and 9 WHEREAS, the first delegation from Japan to Washington, 10 D.C. stopped en route to Hawaii and was received by Kamehameha 11 IV in 1864 before meeting the President of the United States; 12 13 and 14 WHEREAS, Geneva was an independent country, a city-state, 15 for many centuries, and on November 28, 1843, Great Britain and 16 France, in a joint declaration, recognized the independence of 17 the Kingdom of Hawaii; and 18 19 WHEREAS, like Geneva, Hawaii attracts visitors from around 20 the world and many different languages can be heard on the 21 streets, in stores, in hotels and businesses, in institutions of 22 higher learning, and on school campuses in Hawaii; and 23 24 WHEREAS, Hawaii is centrally located in the middle of the 25 Pacific Ocean and is accessible to people from the Americas, 26 Oceania, Asia, Australia, New Zealand, and the Russian 27 Federation, the European nation that borders the Pacific; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the United States is currently in a war, and it 30 becomes increasingly evident that war is not the answer to the 31 32 world's problems; and 33 WHEREAS, Hawaii is the perfect location for exploring 34 peacekeeping options because Hawaiian values are values of peace 35 - acceptance, unconditional personal regard, harmony, balance, 36 patience, respect, pleasantness, and humility - expressed 37 through the Hawaiian concepts of mahalo, aloha, lokahi, pono, 38 ahonui, akahai, `olu`olu, `ihi, and ha`aha`a; and 39 40 WHEREAS, Hawaii received a national award in 2005 for the 41 Hawaii State government's emphasis on promoting diversity and 42 advancing minorities and women in the workplace; and 43

WHEREAS, in 1918, President Woodrow Wilson's speech, 1 "Fourteen Points," depicted his vision for lasting peace, 2 leading to the development of the League of Nations; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Geneva became the headquarters of the League of 5 Nations in 1920 and served as the forerunner to the United 6 Nations and is presently the European Headquarters of the United 7 8 Nations; and 9 WHEREAS, Hawaii is home to the Spark M. Matsunaga Institute 10 for Peace at the University of Hawaii at Manoa (UH), founded on 11 the late United States Senator Spark Matsunaga's encouragement 12 for Hawaii, "to create . . . a sanctuary for seekers of peaceful 13 ways and traditions"; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Senator Spark Matsunaga, like President Woodrow 16 Wilson, believed that the world would be better if more of us 17 learned how to peacefully resolve disputes of all kinds from 18 interpersonal to global; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the Spark M. Matsunaga Institute for Peace is a 21 multi-disciplinary academic community of scholars, students, 22 practitioners, and visitors who, through teaching, research, 23 service, and application, seeks to use Hawaii's "strategic 24 Pacific location to bring people together and renew the 25 University's responsibility to provide a safe sanctuary for a 26 civil and respectful exchange of perspectives and ideas", and 27 regularly convenes forums, workshops, classes, and public 28 29 meetings; and 30 WHEREAS, the mission of the Spark M. Matsunaga Institute 31 for Peace is dedicated to building on Hawaii's cultural heritage 32 and island values, including aloha, mutual aid and respect, 33 sense of community, caring for the land, and reliance on each 34 other, to promote cross-cultural communication and peacemaking 35 leadership; now, therefore, 36 37 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 38 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 39 Session of 2007, that the Spark M. Matsunaga Institute for 40 Peace, located within the Center for Policy Studies at the 41 University of Hawaii at Manoa, is requested to convene a working 42 group to explore the possibility of designating Hawaii as the 43 "Geneva of the Pacific"; and 44 HR HMS 2007-3077
