HOUSE RESOLUTION

ESTABLISHING AN INTERIM HOUSE TASK FORCE TO EVALUATE THE PROPRIETY, MERITS, AND, IF FOUND, POSSIBLE PROCEDURES FOR A STANDARDS OF CONDUCT COMMITTEE TO HANDLE POTENTIAL CONFLICTS OF INTERESTS AND OTHER BREACHES OF THE STANDARDS OF CONDUCT BY MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

1	WHEREAS, Hawaii's legislators are entrusted by the people		
2	of this State to serve the public interest; and		
3 4	WHEREAS, high ethical standards among the members of the		
5	Legislature are essential to assure the trust, respect, and		
6	confidence of the people of Hawaii; and		
7			
8	WHEREAS, in order to preserve the public's confidence in		
9	state government, the Legislature should conduct its business in		
10	a manner that preserves the integrity of the legislative		
11	process; and		
12			
13	WHEREAS, through the responsible use of this political		
14	power, legislators demonstrate their understanding and respect		
15	for those on whose behalf they have accepted this trust; and		
16			
17	WHEREAS, adoption of broader standards and transparency in		
18	the resolution of ethical conflicts is imperative both to enable		
19	the public to understand the intricacies of the legislative		
20	process and its effects on the legislators as well as to provide		
21	the legislators with guidance when confronted with the		
22	inevitable conflicts between their responsibility to the public		
23	and their need to pursue their employment outside the		
24	Legislature; and		
25 26	THERE there needs for othing and avoidance of conflicts		
26	WHEREAS, these needs for ethics and avoidance of conflicts		
27	of interest must be balanced against the public's commitment to		
28	a part-time citizen Legislature, which requires that legislators

be drawn from all parts of society and implies that legislators 1 are expected and permitted to earn outside income; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, the 1978 Constitutional Convention found that public officers "must exhibit the highest standards of ethical 5 conduct"; towards that end, and to enhance public confidence, 6 the Legislature established standards of conduct for legislators 7 8 through the enactment of Chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 9 which also established the State Ethics Commission, an independent body to administer and enforce the Code of Ethics; 10 11 and 12 WHEREAS, although the State Ethics Commission has 13 jurisdiction over legislators' alleged conflicts of interests, 14 additional procedures may be necessary within the Legislature 15 itself to allow the Legislature to promptly identify and advise 16 its members on potential conflicts of interest, and to 17 18 investigate, evaluate, and pass judgment on those of its members who may have violated the public's trust; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives also has its own 21 internal rules, promulgated as Rule 60, Code of Legislative 22 Conduct, that prescribes the ethical standards of its members; 23 however, this rule does not appear to comprehensively address 24 25 the multitude and complexity of issues that can surround ethical standards of House members; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the United States Senate, 108th Congress, 1st 28 Session, also has its own Senate Ethics Manual, consisting of 29 over 506 substantive pages, that appears to comprehensively 30 define and prescribe its members standards in relation to gifts, 31 conflicts of interest and outside earned income, prohibition on 32 33 unofficial office accounts, financial disclosure, political activity, use of government equipment and facilities, 34 constituent services, and employment practices; and 35 36 WHEREAS, to strengthen public confidence in their elected 37 officials and provide guidance to state officials and employees, 38 the House of Representatives finds that an evaluation of 39 additional and different standards of conduct is a worthwhile 40 41 endeavor; now, therefore,
