
HOUSE RESOLUTION

STRONGLY SUPPORTING THE EFFORTS OF THE JERUSALEM PROJECT AND
EXTENDING EXPRESSIONS OF HOPE FOR A CONTINUUM OF PEACEFUL
INTERACTION, COOPERATION, AND DIALOGUE BETWEEN THE PEOPLES
AND THE NATIONS OF THE MIDDLE EAST.

1 WHEREAS, following the conclusion of the Second World War,
2 including the Holocaust, the General Assembly of the United
3 Nations passed Resolution 181, which attempted to resolve the
4 Arab-Israeli conflict in the British mandate of Palestine by
5 partitioning the territory of Palestine into two states, a
6 Jewish state and an Arab state; and

7
8 WHEREAS, based on Resolution 181, the land allocated to the
9 proposed Arab state consisted of all of the highlands, except
10 Jerusalem, plus one third of the coastline, amounting to forty-
11 three per cent of Mandatory Palestine; and

12
13 WHEREAS, the land allotted to the proposed Jewish state
14 consisted of the lowland plains, amounting to fifty-six per cent
15 of Mandatory Palestine; and

16
17 WHEREAS, the greater Jerusalem area, under the provisions
18 of Resolution 181, was designated to be under international
19 control; and

20
21 WHEREAS, the Jewish Agency, as well as the majority of
22 Jewish organizations and individuals accepted the United
23 Nation's proposal, but regional Arab leadership strongly opposed
24 the plan due to concerns about Jewish self-determination and the
25 quantity and quality of land given to the Jews in the proposed
26 plan; and

27
28 WHEREAS, shortly after the ratification of Resolution 181,
29 the Arab Higher Committee declared a three-day strike and public
30 protest to begin on December 2, 1947, in protest of the
31 Resolution 181, resulting in what became known as the "Jerusalem
32 riots," in which for three days, Arabs attacked the commercial
33 center of Jerusalem, burning numerous buildings and shops; and

2 WHEREAS, the riots of Jerusalem soon evolved into
3 widespread fighting between local, indigenous Arabs and Jews,
4 and;

5
6 WHEREAS, the State of Israel was proclaimed on May 14,
7 1948, and;

8
9 WHEREAS, immediately following the State of Israel's
10 establishment, Israel's Arab neighbors - Egypt, Iraq, Jordan,
11 Syria, and Lebanon - simultaneously declared war on Israel and
12 launched an all out, omnidirectional attack on the Jewish state,
13 in what has now become known by historians as the 1948 War of
14 Independence; and

15
16 WHEREAS, Israel's invaders broadcasted radio messages
17 inciting Palestinian Arabs to join in the fight with invading
18 forces, under the promise that, once defeated, Israel's
19 territories would be given to them; and

20
21 WHEREAS, Israel successfully repulsed the invading armies,
22 and the Palestinian Arabs who rose up against Israel were
23 internally displaced, creating a massive refugee crisis; and

24
25 WHEREAS, the invading nations who had initially incited the
26 Palestinian Arabs to fight against Israel, later rejected the
27 thousands of refugees who flocked to their borders following the
28 end of the War of Independence; and

29
30 WHEREAS, decades of war, conflict, insurgency, and strained
31 diplomatic relations have existed between the State of Israel
32 and her neighboring states since the War of Independence in
33 1948; and

34
35 WHEREAS, the ongoing Arab-Israeli conflict and global war
36 on terrorism has discouraged persons worldwide, and especially
37 from the State of Hawaii, from traveling to Jerusalem and other
38 sites revered as holy by many faiths; and

40 WHEREAS, the mission of the Jerusalem Project is to build
41 The Creator's House, a place of worship in Jerusalem where
42 peacemakers of all nations may gather together in goodwill,
43 forgiveness, and aloha; and

1 WHEREAS, a delegation representing the Jerusalem Project
 2 will soon travel from Honolulu for Damascus, Syria, to increase
 3 awareness and promote the construction of The Creator's House;
 4 and

5
 6 WHEREAS, representatives of the Jerusalem Project plan to
 7 make presentations to local neighborhood boards, seeking their
 8 advice and support; now, therefore,

9
 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
 11 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
 12 Session of 2007, that this body strongly supports the efforts of
 13 the Jerusalem Project to facilitate unity and forgiveness
 14 through efforts such as The Creator's House, and extends
 15 expressions of hope for a continuum of peaceful interaction,
 16 cooperation, and dialogue between the peoples and nations of the
 17 Middle East; and

18
 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
 20 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the President of the
 21 United States, the President of the General Assembly of the
 22 United Nations, the Prime Minister of the State of Israel, the
 23 Secretary-General of the Arab League, and the Director of the
 24 Jerusalem Project.
