HOUSE RESOLUTION

STRONGLY SUPPORTING THE EFFORTS OF THE JERUSALEM PROJECT AND EXTENDING EXPRESSIONS OF HOPE FOR A CONTINUUM OF PEACEFUL INTERACTION, COOPERATION, AND DIALOGUE BETWEEN THE PEOPLES AND THE NATIONS OF THE MIDDLE EAST.

WHEREAS, following the conclusion of the Second World War, 1 including the Holocaust, the General Assembly of the United 2 Nations passed Resolution 181, which attempted to resolve the 3 Arab-Israeli conflict in the British mandate of Palestine by 4 partitioning the territory of Palestine into two states, a 5 Jewish state and an Arab state; and 6 7 WHEREAS, based on Resolution 181, the land allocated to the 8 proposed Arab state consisted of all of the highlands, except 9 Jerusalem, plus one third of the coastline, amounting to forty-10 three per cent of Mandatory Palestine; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the land allotted to the proposed Jewish state 13 consisted of the lowland plains, amounting to fifty-six per cent 14 of Mandatory Palestine; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the greater Jerusalem area, under the provisions 17 of Resolution 181, was designated to be under international 18 19 control; and 20 WHEREAS, the Jewish Agency, as well as the majority of 21 Jewish organizations and individuals accepted the United 22 Nation's proposal, but regional Arab leadership strongly opposed 23 the plan due to concerns about Jewish self-determination and the 24 quantity and quality of land given to the Jews in the proposed 25 plan; and 26 27 WHEREAS, shortly after the ratification of Resolution 181, 28 the Arab Higher Committee declared a three-day strike and public 29 protest to begin on December 2, 1947, in protest of the 30 Resolution 181, resulting in what became known as the "Jerusalem 31 riots," in which for three days, Arabs attacked the commercial 32 center of Jerusalem, burning numerous buildings and shops; and 33

1 2 WHEREAS, the riots of Jerusalem soon evolved into widespread fighting between local, indigenous Arabs and Jews, 3 4 and; 5 WHEREAS, the State of Israel was proclaimed on May 14, 6 7 1948, and; 8 WHEREAS, immediately following the State of Israel's 9 establishment, Israel's Arab neighbors - Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, 10 Syria, and Lebanon - simultaneously declared war on Israel and 11 launched an all out, omnidirectional attack on the Jewish state, 12 in what has now become known by historians as the 1948 War of 13 Independence; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Israel's invaders broadcasted radio messages 16 inciting Palestinian Arabs to join in the fight with invading 17 forces, under the promise that, once defeated, Israel's 18 territories would be given to them; and 19 20 WHEREAS, Israel successfully repulsed the invading armies, 21 and the Palestinian Arabs who rose up against Israel were 22 internally displaced, creating a massive refugee crisis; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the invading nations who had initially incited the 25 Palestinian Arabs to fight against Israel, later rejected the 26 thousands of refugees who flocked to their borders following the 27 end of the War of Independence; and 28 29 WHEREAS, decades of war, conflict, insurgency, and strained 30 diplomatic relations have existed between the State of Israel 31 and her neighboring states since the War of Independence in 32 1948; and 33 34 WHEREAS, the ongoing Arab-Israeli conflict and global war 35 on terrorism has discouraged persons worldwide, and especially 36 from the State of Hawaii, from traveling to Jerusalem and other 37 sites revered as holy by many faiths; and 38 39 WHEREAS, the mission of the Jerusalem Project is to build 40 The Creator's House, a place of worship in Jerusalem where 41 peacemakers of all nations may gather together in goodwill, 42 forgiveness, and aloha; and 43 44

WHEREAS, a delegation representing the Jerusalem Project
will soon travel from Honolulu for Damascus, Syria, to increase
awareness and promote the construction of The Creator's House;
and

6 WHEREAS, representatives of the Jerusalem Project plan to 7 make presentations to local neighborhood boards, seeking their 8 advice and support; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 10 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 11 Session of 2007, that this body strongly supports the efforts of 12 the Jerusalem Project to facilitate unity and forgiveness 13 through efforts such as The Creator's House, and extends 14 expressions of hope for a continuum of peaceful interaction, 15 cooperation, and dialogue between the peoples and nations of the 16 Middle East; and 17

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 20 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the President of the 21 United States, the President of the General Assembly of the 22 United Nations, the Prime Minister of the State of Israel, the 23 Secretary-General of the Arab League, and the Director of the 24 Jerusalem Project.
