HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII TO TAKE ACTION TO OBTAIN ASSISTANCE FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE TO CONDUCT AN ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT OF THE STORAGE USE, AND DISPOSAL OF DEPLETED URANIUM MUNITIONS IN HAWAII.

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization has released several
reports and scientific studies concerning the health risks from
exposure to depleted uranium; and

5 WHEREAS, the chemical and radiological toxicity of depleted 6 uranium has been a reported cause of kidney dysfunction, damage 7 to lung cells that increases the possibility of lung cancer, 8 neurological disorders, liver infection, and high miscarriage 9 rates among military personnel who have returned from a 10 designated combat zone or qualified hazardous duty area where 11 depleted uranium munitions have been used; and

13 WHEREAS, in recent times, many parts of our State, 14 including Makua Valley and Schofield Barracks on the island of 15 Oahu and Pohakuloa on the island of Hawaii, have been subject to 16 small-arms live-fire and artillery practice; and

18 WHEREAS, there is a public health need to ensure the safe 19 storage, use, disposal, and clean-up of munitions and other 20 products containing depleted uranium within the State of Hawaii; 21 now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 23 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 24 Session of 2007, that Hawaii's congressional delegation is 25 requested to take action to obtain the assistance of the United 26 States Department of Defense to conduct an environmental 27 assessment of the scope and adequacy of depleted uranium 28 storage, use, and disposal in Hawaii and report on training 29 received by members of the Armed Forces involved in the handling 30



1	of depleted uranium munitions on exposure to depleted uranium;

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4	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Hawaii's congressional
5	delegation is requested to notify the Legislature of any
6	developments before the convening of the Regular Session of
7	2008; and
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9	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
10	Resolution be transmitted to the members of Hawaii's
11	congressional delegation; the Governor; the Commander, United
12	States Pacific Command; the Adjutant General; and the Director
13	of Health.
