HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TO PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO STUDENTS FROM PACIFIC ISLAND JURISDICTIONS THAT HAVE HISTORICAL TIES TO THE UNITED STATES BUT DO NOT HAVE PUBLIC HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS THAT GRANT BACCALAUREATE DEGREES.

WHEREAS, Hawaii has the largest Pacific Islander population 1 of any state, both in real numbers and as a percentage of total 2 3 population; and 4 5 WHEREAS, in 1997, the Office of Management and Budget directed all federal agencies to classify Pacific Islanders as a 6 distinct and separate racial group called "Native Hawaiian and 7 Other Pacific Islander"; and 8 9 WHEREAS, this group suffers from higher poverty rates and 10 other distressing social and economic conditions, especially in 11 the state of Hawaii; and 12 13 WHEREAS, educational attainment is related to greater 14 economic success and personal well-being; and 15 16 WHEREAS, greater access to financial aid is very much 17 related to college enrollment and completion; and 18 19 WHEREAS, United States (U.S.) Census data reflects that 20 native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders are 21 underrepresented in higher education both at the undergraduate 22 and graduate levels; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii (UH) has a long history 25 of providing access to educational opportunities for individuals 26 from Pacific Island jurisdictions that have historical ties to 27 the U.S. but do not have public higher educational institutions 28 that grant baccalaureate degrees; and 29

WHEREAS, however, in 2006, UH adopted a new student 1 financial assistance policy to be implemented in Fall 2007, 2 increasing the tuition rate for these students from the resident 3 rate to 150 percent of the resident rate; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the new policy allows individual UH campuses to 6 award Pacific Islander Scholarships to these students to 7 compensate for the tuition increase, but does not require the 8 scholarships to be given; now, therefore, 9 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 11 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 12 Session of 2007, that the University of Hawaii is requested to 13 provide financial assistance to students from Pacific Island 14 jurisdictions that have historical ties to the U.S. but do not 15 have public higher educational institutions that grant 16 baccalaureate degrees; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, as part of its financial 19 assistance program, UH is requested to include: 20 21 (1)The requirement that all UH campuses provide Pacific 22 Islander Scholarships to these students; or 23 24 Returning the tuition rate for these students to the 25 (2) resident rate, such as that charged to other non-26 residents including East-West Center student grantees, 27 active-duty U.S. military personnel stationed in 28 Hawaii and their authorized dependents, members of the 29 Hawaii National Guard and the U.S. military reserves, 30 native Hawaiians who claim residence outside of 31 Hawaii, and UH employees, their spouses, and their 32 dependents; 33 34 35 and 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of UH is 37 requested to monitor the impact of the new student financial 38 assistance policy that will be implemented in Fall 2007, and 39 submit a report to the Legislature, no later than 20 days prior 40
