HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO SURVEY WHETHER AND HOW WORKERS' COMPENSATION LAWS IN OTHER STATES ARE USED TO COVER EMPLOYEE DISABILITIES CAUSED BY MULTIPLE CHEMICAL SENSITIVITIES.

WHEREAS, although no consensus has been reached for a case 1 definition of "multiple chemical sensitivities", according to 2 the National Institutes of Health's National Institute of 3 Environmental Health Sciences, the term, also known as "20th 4 Century Syndrome", "environmental illness", "sick building 5 syndrome", idiopathic environmental intolerance, and TILT 6 (toxicant-induced loss of tolerance), can be defined as a 7 chronic, recurring disease caused by a person's inability to 8 9 tolerate an environmental chemical or class of foreign chemicals; and 10

WHEREAS, multiple chemical sensitivities has been described as a group of sensitivities to extraordinarily low levels of environmental chemicals appearing to develop in some individuals without prior history following acute or chronic exposure to a wide variety of environmental agents including various pesticides, solvents, drugs, and air contaminants in so-called sick buildings; and

20 WHEREAS, some researchers contend that the term multiple chemical sensitivities refer to complaints of patients who 21 report recurrent nonspecific symptoms referable to multiple 22 organ systems that the sufferers believe are provoked by 23 exposure to low levels of chemical, biological, or physical 24 25 agents, yet other researchers have found no consistent physical findings or laboratory abnormalities to differentiate multiple 26 27 chemical sensitivities patients from the remainder of the 28 population; and

30 WHEREAS, while some researchers espouse various theories as 31 to the causes of multiple chemical sensitivities, other 32 researchers either doubt the existence of the disease as there 33 is little concrete evidence to support it, or suspect a 34 psychosomatic cause; and

1 2 WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the State of Hawaii to 3 protect its workers who suffer from multiple chemical 4 sensitivities; now, therefore, 5 6 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 7 Session of 2007, that the Legislative Reference Bureau is 8 9 requested to survey whether and how workers' compensation laws in other states are used to cover employee disabilities caused 10 by multiple chemical sensitivities; and 11 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau is further requested to develop a workable model by which 14 the State can cover disabilities caused by multiple chemical 15 sensitivities through the State's workers' compensation law; and 16 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Labor and 19 Industrial Relations is requested to provide assistance to the 20 Legislative Reference Bureau, if requested; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to submit its findings and recommendations, 23 24 including any necessary proposed legislation, to the Legislature 25 not later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2008; and 26 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 29 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the Legislative Reference Bureau and the Director of Labor and Industrial 30 31 Relations. 32 33 34 OFFERED BY: MAR 1 4 2007 HR LRB 07-3453.doc
