HOUSE RESOLUTION

ESTABLISHING A BUILDING TRADES TASK FORCE TO STUDY AND REVIEW JURISDICTIONAL AND SCOPE OF PRACTICE ISSUES BETWEEN THE BUILDING TRADES IN HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, the construction industry has always played a 2 large role in the building and enhancement of Hawaii's economy, 3 from the days when the construction crane was referred to as the 4 "state bird", to the recent boom in housing and military 5 contracts; and

WHEREAS, the construction industry consists of many
building trades, including bricklayers, carpenters, carpet
layers, cement workers, electricians, elevator constructors,
heavy equipment operators, ironworkers, joiners, laborers,
landscape architects, masons, painters, pipefitters, plumbers,
plasterers, tapers, tile layers, and welders; and

14 WHEREAS, many of these building trades work in conjunction 15 with each other, often forming a symbiotic relationship that 16 depends on each trade completing its responsibilities for the 17 project to reach completion; and

19 WHEREAS, oversight of some of the building industry 20 professionals and trades, such as architects, landscape 21 architects, contractors, electricians, elevator mechanics, 22 engineers, plumbers, and surveyors, is currently accomplished 23 through licensing boards within the Professional and Vocational 24 Licensing Division (PVL) of the Department of Commerce and 25 Consumer Affairs (DCCA); and

26 27 WHEREAS, DCCA also investigates complaints against 28 professionals licensed by the PVL and protects the public 29 from unlicensed activities through its Regulated Industries 30 Complaints Office; and

WHEREAS, questions and concerns have been raised by several 1 of the building trades, particularly electricians, plumbers, 2 laborers, and landscape architects regarding jurisdictional 3 issues, oversight, scope of practice, qualifications, and 4 licensure; now, therefore, 5 6 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 7 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 8 Session of 2007, that a Building Trades Task Force (Task Force) 9 be established and convened to study and review jurisdictional 10 and scope of practice issues relating to all building trades in 11 Hawaii; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that members of the Task Force 14 15 include: 16 The chair of the House Committee of Labor and Public (1)17 Employment, who shall serve as a co-chair of the Task 18 Force; 19 20 (2) The chair of the House Committee on Consumer 21 Protection and Commerce, who shall serve as a co-chair 22 of the Task Force; 23 24 (3) The Director of DCCA, or a designee; 25 26 The Director of the Department of Labor and Industrial 27 (4) Relations, or a designee; 28 29 The chair of the Board of Electricians and Plumbers, (5) 30 31 or a designee; 32 (6) An individual representing the construction industry, 33 or a designee; 34 35 The President of the International Brotherhood of (7) 36 Electrical Workers, or a designee; 37 38 The President of the Plumbers and Pipefitters, Local 39 (8) 675, or a designee; 40

(9) The President of the Laborers' International Union of 1 North America, Local 368; and 2 3 (10) Any other professionals or individuals deemed 4 necessary by the co-chairs of the Task Force; 5 6 7 and 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force is requested to 9 review current practices regarding oversight and jurisdiction of 10 electricians and plumbers currently practicing in Hawaii; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force study and 13 determine whether overlap exists between the scope of practice 14 15 of electricians and plumbers; and 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Task Force is requested to 17 submit a report to the Legislature regarding the Task Force's 18 findings and recommendations no later than 20 days prior to the 19 convening of the Regular Session of 2008; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 22 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Commerce and 23 Consumer Affairs, Director of Labor and Industrial Relations, 24 the chair of the Board of Electricians and Plumbers, the 25 President of the International Brotherhood of Electrical 26 Workers, the President of the Plumbers and Pipefitters, Local 27 675, AFL-CIO, and the President of the Laborers' International 28 Union of North America, Local 368. 29 30 31 32 OFFERED BY Max x
