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HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR TO REQUEST THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT TO PROHIBIT DUMPING OF VESSEL SEWAGE WITHIN THE HAWAIIAN ISLANDS HUMPBACK WHALE NATIONAL MARINE SANCTUARY.

WHEREAS, our ocean ecosystems represent a precious natural 1 resource for our state, providing a unique and wondrous 2 3 attraction for both residents and visitors; and 4 WHEREAS, the waters of the Hawaiian Islands Humpback Whale 5 National Marine Sanctuary (Whale and Marine Sanctuary), 6 established under federal law and located in various areas off 7 the coasts of Kauai, Oahu, Maui, Molokai, Lanai, and the Big 8 Island, represent critical habitats in winter months for the 9 endangered north Pacific humpback whale; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the waters of the Whale and Marine Sanctuary are 12 where these endangered humpback whales breed, calve, and nurse 13 their young; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the waters of the Whale and Marine Sanctuary 16 provide important habitats for other endangered and protected 17 species, such as the green sea turtle, hawksbill sea turtle, and 18 19 the monk seal; and 20 WHEREAS, the waters of the Whale and Marine Sanctuary 21 include complex, vulnerable ecosystems of coral reefs and reef-22 23 based animal and plant populations; and 24 WHEREAS, the waters of the Whale and Marine Sanctuary 25 include areas previously designated for preservation of wildlife 26 by the State, including the Molokini Shoal Marine Life and Bird 27 Conservation District, Honolua-Mokuleia Marine Life Conservation 28 District, Manele-Hulopoe Marine Life Conservation District, 29 Hanauma Bay Marine Life Conservation District, Pupukea Marine 30 Life Conservation District, Lapakahi Marine Life Conservation 31 District, Waialea Bay Marine Life Conservation District, and the 32 marine portion of the Ahihi-Kinau Natural Area Reserve; and 33

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WHEREAS, ocean resources such as the waters of the Whale 1 and Marine Sanctuary represent a vital component of Hawaii's 2 essential visitor industry; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, visitors and residents alike enjoy the resources of the Whale and Marine Sanctuary in a variety of ways, 6 including snorkeling, diving, fishing, kayaking, canoeing, and 7 wildlife observation tours; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, unfortunately, there have been increasing numbers of complaints from residents and visitors alike regarding the 11 practice of tour boat operators dumping concentrated human 12 sewage into the waters of the Whale and Marine Sanctuary; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the County Council of Maui has responded to this 15 problem by adopting a resolution in February of 2006 stating 16 that "...it is imperative that dumping of raw sewage and 17 chemical contaminants into our ocean cease immediately, and that 18 our precious marine ecosystem, which our residents and tourist 19 industry cherish and depend on, be protected..."; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the County of Maui has also taken the initiative 22 in addressing this problem by providing funds to reimburse 23 vessel operators who use mobile, dock-side "pumper" trucks that 24 haul the sewage for land-based treatment; and 25 26 WHEREAS, other governmental agencies have indicated support 27 for these mobile "pumper" trucks to haul sewage for land-based 28 29 treatment; and 30 WHEREAS, mobile, dock-side "pumper" trucks are available at 31 certain harbors; and 32 33 34 WHEREAS, the State has provided permanent facilities at certain other harbors; and 35 36 37 WHEREAS, the State has prohibited the dumping of most vessel sewage within state waters; and 38 39 40 WHEREAS, the federal government can and should prohibit the dumping of sewage in the waters of the Whale and Marine 41 Sanctuary by: 42



(1) Rule-making, pursuant to the enabling legislation 1 authorizing and creating the Whale and Marine Sanctuary (The 2 3 National Marine Sanctuaries Act, 16 U.S.C. 1431 et seq., as amended, and the Hawaii Islands National Marine Sanctuary Act 4 subtitle C, title II, Pub. L. 102-587, as amended); and 5 6 7 (2)Creation of a no-discharge zone, pursuant to the Clean Water Act (United States Code, Title 33, Chapter 26); 8 9 and 10 WHEREAS, residents of Hawaii have requested a no-discharge 11 zone for the waters of the Whale and Marine Sanctuary, and such 12 residents were informed that no request for a no-discharge zone 13 had been received from the State of Hawaii, and such residents 14 were further informed that pursuant to the Clean Water Act, a 15 request is required to be received from the State of Hawaii in 16 order for the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to create a 17 no-discharge zone; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the EPA must consider a request for a no-discharge 20 zone from the State of Hawaii pursuant to the Clean Water Act; 21 22 and 23 WHEREAS, residents of Hawaii have requested the Whale and 24 Marine Sanctuary to begin rule-making procedures designed to 25 prohibit the dumping of sewage by tour vessels within the Whale 26 and Marine Sanctuary, and such rule-making procedures have not 27 been instituted; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii's representative serves as Co-30 Manager of the Whale and Marine Sanctuary; and 31 32 WHEREAS, the Department of Commerce is the federal agency 33 responsible for the administration of the Whale and Marine 34 Sanctuary, and the EPA is the federal agency responsible for the 35 administration of the Clean Water Act; and 36 37 WHEREAS, the sewage dumped in federal waters within the 38 Whale and Marine Sanctuary has a negative impact on the health, 39 welfare, and enjoyment of the residents and visitors of Hawaii; 40 now, therefore, 41



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BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, that the Governor is requested to urge the federal government to prohibit dumping of vessel sewage within the boundaries of the Whale and Marine Sanctuary; and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Department of Land 8 and Natural Resources and other state agencies and personnel, 9 including Hawaii's Co-Manager of the Hawaiian Islands Humpback 10 Whale National Marine Sanctuary, are requested to cooperate 11 with, assist, and encourage efforts to prohibit dumping of 12 vessel sewage within the boundaries of the Whale and Marine 13 Sanctuary; and

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 16 Resolution be transmitted to the United States Secretary of 17 Commerce, Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency, 18 the Governor, Director of Land and Natural Resources, and 19 Hawaii's Congressional Delegation.
