## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CIVIL DEFENSE DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE, IN COOPERATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, TO BEGIN NECESSARY PREPARATIONS TO ESTABLISH A MOBILE EMERGENCY HOSPITAL UNIT IN HAWAII.

WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii has the responsibility of 1 protecting and serving its communities by providing appropriate 2 3 medical services during an emergency in a timely manner; and 4 WHEREAS, the significance of this responsibility has been 5 demonstrated repeatedly during Hawaii's hurricane seasons, 6 earthquakes, flash floods, tsunamis, sudden horrific tragedies 7 8 such as the Sacred Falls landslide, the collision and sinking of the Ehime Maru sea vessel, and evacuations of schools due to 9 hazardous materials conditions; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, a mobile emergency department and hospital, known as a MED-1 unit, can respond to crisis situations and provide 13 14 instant on-site medical attention ranging from emergency medical care, surgical trauma, critical care, and anesthesia; and 15 16 WHEREAS, a MED-1 unit can serve as a "surge hospital," 17 designed to respond to surges in numbers of patients during 18 19 emergencies, or as a stand-alone guarantine facility capable of providing 14 general medical beds and expandable to accommodate 20 as many as several hundred patients when a tenting system is in 21 22 place; and 23 WHEREAS, in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, more than 24 7,000 patients were served by a MED-1 unit set up in a parking 25 lot in Waveland, Mississippi, for seven weeks when the existing 26 27 local health care infrastructure was destroyed; and



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WHEREAS, a MED-1 unit served as a major trauma center and 1 emergency room in New Orleans during the 2006 Mardi Gras when 2 the existing medical infrastructures were in bad repair; and 3 4 WHEREAS, a MED-1 unit can also serve as a quarantine 5 facility in the event of a hazardous materials attack, pandemic, 7 avian flu outbreak, or any disaster-related outbreak requiring quarantine; and WHEREAS, in addition to serving as a medical resource during emergencies and disasters, a MED-1 unit can also provide 11 primary care and necessary healthcare infrastructure to 12 communities lacking medical resources in parts of the islands 13 where needs have already been identified, including Kahuku, 14 Puna, and other areas; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, as a mobile emergency department and hospital on wheels, a MED-1 unit can be transported to various sites and may 18 19 also be airlifted between islands via military transport 20 airplanes; and 21 22 WHEREAS, a MED-1 unit provides a mobile support trailer stocked with essential medical supplies and equipment, as well 23 as living and sleeping quarters for a team of healthcare 24 providers that can travel with the unit; and 25 26 WHEREAS, Hawaii's isolation as a chain of islands requires 27 sufficient and immediate emergency medical response from within 28 the state until support from the mainland or elsewhere arrives; 29 30 and WHEREAS, a MED-1 unit would afford the people of Hawaii 32 immediate access to medical resources during a natural or man-33 made disaster; now, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, that the Civil Defense Division of the Department of Defense (Civil Defense), in cooperation with the Department of Health (DOH), is requested to begin necessary preparations to establish a mobile emergency hospital MED-1 unit

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1 in Hawaii as a shared resource between Civil Defense and DOH,
2 based on the known need for a comprehensive natural and man-made
3 disaster response plan; and
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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Civil
Defense, and Director of Health.
