HOUSE RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE USE OF THE NAME "PAPAHĀNAUMOKUĀKEA MARINE NATIONAL MONUMENT".

WHEREAS, President George W. Bush by Proclamation 8031 of 1 June 15, 2006, established the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands 2 Marine National Monument; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the President in his proclamation described the 5 diverse ecosystem of the approximately one thousand two hundred 6 nautical-mile stretch of coral islands, seamounts, banks, and 7 shoals that he wished to protect; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the proclamation also described the area's great 10 cultural significance to native Hawaiians and its connection to 11 early Polynesian culture; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the President stated that officials would consult 14 with native Hawaiians to give the monument a native Hawaiian 15 name; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the Northwestern Hawaiian Islands Native Hawaiian 18 Cultural Working Group (cultural working group) consists of 19 members with extensive involvement in those islands and includes 20 cultural practitioners, community activists, academic scholars, 21 teachers, and resource managers; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the cultural working group requested two 24 distinguished kūpuna, specifically, Uncle Buzzy Agard and Aunty 25 Pua Kanahele, to suggest names for the Monument; and 26 27 WHEREAS, Uncle Buzzy and Aunty Pua offered names, as did 28 native Hawaiian representatives from the Kamakakūokalani, the 29 University of Hawaii Center for Hawaiian Studies, and the United 30 States Department of the Interior's Office of Hawaiian 31 Relations; and 32 33 WHEREAS, at Washington Place in Honolulu on March 2, 2007, 34 First Lady Laura Bush, following a collaborative effort among 35

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federal agencies, state agencies including the Department of 1 Land and Natural Resources, the Kahoolawe Island Reserve 2 Commission, and the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, and the Cultural 3 Working Group, announced the monument's Hawaiian name, 4 Papahānaumokuākea, and on that day President Bush amended his 5 Proclamation 8031 to change the title of the monument to 6 Papahānaumokuākea Marine National Monument; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the name Papahānaumokuākea is filled with meaning 9 and tradition, including reference to the genealogy and 10 formation of the Hawaiian archipelago, all of which strengthens 11 Hawaii's cultural foundation within significant elements of our 12 past through native Hawaiian ancestors, and expresses our hopes 13 for Papahānaumokuākea to provide spiritual inspiration and 14 perpetuation of our natural and cultural resources; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the naming process and the giving of a Hawaiian 17 name is an important and sacred component of traditional 18 Hawaiian culture; and 19 20 WHEREAS, article XV, section 4 of the Hawaii State 21 Constitution makes English and Hawaiian the official languages 22 of Hawaii; now, therefore, 23 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 25 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 26 Session of 2007, that residents, government agencies, and 27 private organizations of the United States and Hawaii are 28 encouraged to refer to the monument by its official new name, 29 the Papahānaumokuākea Marine National Monument; and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 32 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States, 33 the First Lady of the United States, the President of the United 34 States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of 35 Representatives, the Governor, the President of the Senate of 36 the State of Hawaii, the Speaker of the House of Representatives 37 of the State of Hawaii, the Mayor of the City and County of 38
