HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES TO ENTER INTO A FREE TRADE AGREEMENT WITH TAIWAN.

WHEREAS, the statistics on trade between the United States 1 2 and Taiwan are impressive; and 3 WHEREAS, Taiwan is the United States' eighth largest 4 trading partner, tenth largest export market, and fifth largest 5 farm products market; and 6 7 WHEREAS, in 2005, the trade flow between the United States 8 and Taiwan totaled \$56,900,000,000, and the cumulative United 9 States investment in Taiwan amounted to \$14,100,000,000; and 10 11 WHEREAS, Taiwan has been actively seeking a bilateral free 12 13 trade agreement with the United States; and 14 WHEREAS, such an agreement may provide more opportunities 15 for United States companies to invest in and export to Taiwan; 16 and 17 18 WHEREAS, United States consumers may also benefit from 19 Taiwan products; and 20 21 WHEREAS, Taiwan is already a member of the World Trade 22 Organization and a party to many economic and trade agreements 23 with various countries; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, a free trade agreement may enable the United States to indirectly facilitate the participation of Taiwan in 27 28 multilateral Asian trade agreements; now, therefore, 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 30 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 31 Session of 2007, that this body urges the President of the 32 United States to seriously consider entering into a free trade 33 34 agreement with Taiwan; and 35

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President is requested to undertake negotiations for the free trade agreement in a manner that respects the interests of all countries in the East Asian region; and

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 7 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States, 8 each member of Hawaii's Congressional delegation, and the 9 Director General of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office.
