
HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE ISSUANCE OF VISAS FOR FAMILY REUNIFICATION
OF IMMIGRANT RELATIVES BE EXPEDITED.

1 WHEREAS, the family is an institution of utmost importance
2 to the human society; and
3

4 WHEREAS, the United States is a free and open society that
5 welcomes citizens from around the world; and
6

7 WHEREAS, permitting family members to reunite after a
8 period of separation caused by immigration is highly desirable;
9 and
10

11 WHEREAS, changes in visa procedures following the terrorist
12 attacks of September 11, 2001, reflect the country's concern for
13 ensuring the safety of United States citizens and visitors
14 alike; and
15

16 WHEREAS, in general, it has become a complex and time-
17 consuming process to enter the United States and, in particular,
18 it often takes a very long time to process visas of relatives of
19 legal immigrants; and
20

21 WHEREAS, it must be a goal to expedite visa requests of the
22 relatives of legal immigrants for purposes of family
23 reunification; now, therefore,

25 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
26 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
27 Session of 2007, that the President of the United States and the
28 United States Congress are respectfully urged to establish a
29 process by which visas for family members of legal immigrants
30 can be expedited for purposes of a swift family reunification;

33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
34 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States,
35 the Majority Leader of the United States Senate, the Speaker of



1 the United States House of Representatives, the Secretary of
2 Homeland Security, Hawaii's congressional delegation, and the
3 Governor.
