REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO REEVALUATE THE CURRENT STATUS OF HAWAII'S SISTER RELATIONSHIPS.

20 21 22	(1)	There is commonality between Hawaii and the sister, primarily from geographical, historical, cultural, or economic standpoints;
23 24 25 26	(2)	There are active and interested support groups, such as the Chambers of Commerce, and cultural and civic associations;
27 28 29 30	(3)	There are economic benefits for both sisters, such as increased numbers of visitors, or enhanced investment or marketing opportunities;
31 32 33 34	(4)	Close ties have been established between the educational institutions of the two potential sisters, including both student and faculty exchanges; and



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1 There is a clear, strong governmental interest in not 2 (5) only forming, but maintaining, the relationship; and 3 4 WHEREAS, however, to ensure the productivity and viability 5 of a sister relationship, the Department recommended that the 6 7 State needs a rigorous selection process, including reconstituting the Hawaii Sister-State Committee and the re-8 9 utilization of the Sister-State Application Form developed by the erstwhile Office of International Relations, which must 10 incorporate: 11 12 13 (1) A letter from the Governor of the proposed sister; 14 15 (2) A designated point-of-contact person; 16 Recent activity reports between Hawaii and the (3) 17 18 proposed sister; 19 Recommendations for future activities; and (4) 20 21 Proposed calendar of future events; and 22 (5) 23 WHEREAS, although sister agreements traditionally are 24 filled with general statements of friendship and goodwill, the 25 Department recommended that they should include a higher degree 26 of specificity, including each side's responsibilities to ensure 27 that each sister agreement is realistically and mutually 28 beneficial; and 29 30 WHEREAS, furthermore, the Department recommended that the 31 State carefully review the quality of its sister relations to 32 determine which ties should be strengthened and which should be 33 severed; now, therefore, 34 35 36 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 37 Session of 2007, that the Department of Business, Economic 38 Development, and Tourism is requested to reevaluate the current 39 status of Hawaii's sister relationships to ensure that such 40 relationships are mutually beneficial and that truly productive 41 relationships are not trivialized by those that are not 42 43 productive; and 44
