## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM, TO CONDUCT A STUDY TO EVALUATE PLANS BY YOUNG BROTHERS, LTD., TO DISCONTINUE ITS LESS-THAN-CONTAINER-LOAD INTERISLAND CARGO SERVICE.

WHEREAS, interisland cargo service is a vital lifeline for 1 the islands of Hawaii, particularly the Neighbor Islands; and 2 3 WHEREAS, Young Brothers, Ltd. (Young Brothers), runs the 4 state's largest interisland cargo shipping service; and 5 6 WHEREAS, Young Brothers has announced its intention to 7 discontinue its less-than-container-load interisland cargo 8 9 service; and 10 WHEREAS, current customers of Young Brothers, especially 11 farmers on the Neighbor Islands, have expressed grave concerns 12 about Young Brothers' plans; and 13 14 WHEREAS, reliable, affordable, convenient interisland cargo 15 service is essential to the economy of the state and the welfare 16 of its people; now, therefore, 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 19 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 20 Session of 2007, that the Department of Transportation (DOT), in 21 collaboration with the Department of Business, Economic 22 Development, and Tourism, is requested to conduct a study to 23 evaluate plans by Young Brothers to discontinue its less-than-24 container-load interisland cargo service: 25 26 (1) For Kahului, Maui, and Hilo, Hawaii, after January 1, 27 2010; and 28 29 30 (2) For Kona, Hawaii; Honolulu; Molokai; Lanai; and Lihue, Kauai, after January 1, 2012; 31 32 and HR274 HD1 HMS 2007-3914
