
HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO PROCLAIM JULY 18, 2007, AS SHARON
MABE DAY IN THE STATE OF HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, a fundamental part of our culture of aloha
2 includes honoring our elders and teaching future generations to
3 study and learn from the devotion, dedication, deeds, and
4 sacrifices of those who helped build our community and State;
5 and

7 WHEREAS, during the Regular Session of 2006, the House of
8 Representatives of the 23rd Legislature of the State of Hawaii
9 presented Sharon Mabe, a life-long Oahu resident, with a
10 congratulatory certificate upon her retirement after nearly 35
11 years of employment with the United States Department of
12 Defense, having served throughout the duration of the Cold War
13 and into the modern era in critical posts at both Fort Shafter
14 and Hickam Air Force Base; and

16 WHEREAS, Sharon Mabe contributed to the continued defense
17 and security of not only the islands of Hawaii, but the entire
18 United States of America; and

20 WHEREAS, despite being diagnosed with cancer and suffering
21 greatly on a daily basis, Sharon Mabe continued for years in her
22 civil service employment with the United States Pacific Air
23 Forces (PACAF) assignments branch at Hickam Air Force Base; and

25 WHEREAS, within less than three months of retirement and
26 being honored by the 23rd Legislature with a congratulatory
27 certificate for her devoted service, Sharon Mabe died of cancer,
28 survived by her husband and daughter; and

30 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives recognizes that the
31 loss of a person who devoted their entire life to public service
32 is a humbling reminder of the stresses, pressures, and strain
33 that often accompanies the responsibilities of serving the
34 people; and



1 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives is both humbled by
2 and thankful for the efforts of island residents such as Sharon
3 Mabe and recognizes that there are many more like her who
4 continue to serve selflessly; and

6 WHEREAS, Sharon Mabe's service to our State and nation are
7 fully in keeping with our state motto, which proclaims, "Ua mau
8 ke ea o ka aina i ka pono", which is interpreted as "The life of
9 the land is perpetuated in righteousness"; and

11 WHEREAS, the founders of these islands, who braved great
12 danger, difficulty, and uncertainty to create a nation of
13 righteousness, would be proud of persons such as Sharon Mabe;
14 and

16 WHEREAS, future generations of our keiki would do well to
17 learn from the example of persons like Sharon Mabe; and
18

19 WHEREAS, it is not uncommon to recognize persons of
20 exceptional, conspicuous merit and hold their deeds in
21 remembrance by naming certain days in their honor; now,
22 therefore,

24 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
25 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
26 Session of 2007, that the Governor is respectfully requested to
27 proclaim July 18, 2007, as Sharon Mabe Day in the State of
28 Hawaii, commemorating not only the life of Sharon Mabe, but also
29 the memory of the thousands of Hawaii residents who have
30 struggled with and died of cancer; and

32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body urges scientists,
33 researchers, and physicians around the world to continue their
34 aggressive pursuit for a cure for the terrible disease of
35 cancer; and



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; the Cancer Research Center of Hawaii; the American Association for Cancer Research; and to Harris and Kimberly Mabe, surviving family members of Sharon Mabe.
