
HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE ADOPTION OF THE UNITED NATIONS' CONVENTION ON THE
RIGHTS OF THE CHILD.

1 WHEREAS, the principles of the Charter of the United
2 Nations affirm that the recognition of the inherent dignity and
3 the equal and inalienable rights of all members of the human
4 family is the foundation of freedom, justice, and peace in the
5 world; and

6
7 WHEREAS, the United Nations, in the Universal Declaration
8 of Human Rights and the International Covenants on Human Rights,
9 has affirmed that everyone is entitled to all the rights and
10 freedoms set forth therein, without distinction of any kind,
11 such as race, color, sex, language, religion, political or other
12 opinion, national or social origin, property, birth, or other
13 status; and

14
15 WHEREAS, the United Nations, in the Universal Declaration
16 of Human Rights, has proclaimed that each child is entitled to
17 special care and assistance; and

18
19 WHEREAS, the family, as the fundamental unit of society and
20 the natural environment for the growth and well-being of all its
21 members and particularly children, should be afforded the
22 necessary protection and assistance so that it can fully assume
23 its responsibilities with the community; and

24
25 WHEREAS, each child, for the full and harmonious
26 development of the child's personality, should grow up in a
27 family environment, in an atmosphere of happiness, love, and
28 understanding; and

29
30 WHEREAS, to be fully prepared to participate as a member of
31 society, each child needs to be brought up in the spirit of the
32 ideals of the United Nations Charter, especially in the spirit



1 of peace, dignity, tolerance, freedom, equality, and solidarity;
2 and

4 WHEREAS, on November 20, 1989, the United Nations General
5 Assembly adopted the Convention of the Rights of the Child; and

6
7 WHEREAS, one hundred ninety-two nations have entered as
8 signatories to the Convention of the Rights of the Child; and

9
10 WHEREAS, the preamble to the State of Hawaii Constitution
11 proclaims that the State of Hawaii is dedicated to the
12 fulfillment of the State motto, "Ua mau ke ea o ka aina i ka
13 pono," meaning, "The life of the land is perpetuated in
14 righteousness"; and

15
16 WHEREAS, to protect, nurture, and care for our keiki is an
17 underlying principle for Hawaii as a Pacific Island community;
18 and

19
20 WHEREAS, thirteen per cent of all Hawaii's children live in
21 poverty; and

22
23 WHEREAS, twenty-one per cent of the homeless are children
24 age nine or younger, and one out of three are age seventeen or
25 younger; and

26
27 WHEREAS, the Convention on the Rights of the Child
28 contributes to awareness of the problems of children in Hawaii
29 and around the world; now, therefore,

30
31 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
32 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
33 Session of 2007, that the Legislature urges the State of Hawaii
34 to adopt the United Nations' Convention on the Rights of the
35 Child; and

37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature urges the
38 President to request that Congress ratify the Convention on the
39 Rights of the Child; and



1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
2 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States,
3 the Governor, Attorney General, Director of Finance,
4 Superintendent of Education, Director of Health, Director of
5 Human Services, Director of Public Safety, and the Chairperson
6 of the Board of Regents of the University of Hawaii.
