HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO ADOPT ADMINISTRATIVE RULES TO ALLOW THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO GRANT SCHOOL CREDIT TO THE STUDENT MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

WHEREAS, a representative democracy is dependent on a 1 2 citizenry that is informed, prepared, willing, and capable of actively participating in government; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, participation in a representative democracy is a learned behavior; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, for decades, people have become increasingly 9 disengaged from the civic and political institutions of our 10 country, behavior that results from experiences starting at a young age; and 11 12 WHEREAS, youth participation appears to be increasing in 13 the areas of volunteerism, community service, and religious 14 15 activity, but youth awareness of social issues has decreased due to fewer opportunities for political discussions and a weaker 16 17 connection between youth and the community; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the Legislature believes that schools have a mission to "advance the endowment of human nature itself, so 20 that each succeeding generation finds itself further along the 21 22 road towards peace, social justice, and environmental 23 sustainability in a society guided by creativity, compassion, and curiosity," as expressed in the Reinventing Education Act of 24 2004, Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004; and 25 26 WHEREAS, the Legislature supports the Department of 27 28 Education's efforts to promote academic achievement, civic 29 responsibility, and holistic development in its students; and



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WHEREAS, only a few high schools have integrated civic 1 2 learning into their curriculum; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the youth of Hawaii have demonstrated a desire to be engaged and connected with their community and the world 5 around them beyond what academic disciplines can offer; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, participation on non-profit boards is a form of community service and political engagement that helps students 9 10 develop the attitudes, skills, and abilities that may not be learned through the academic disciplines or curricular programs; 11 12 and 13 14 WHEREAS, students who participate on non-profit boards can 15 develop the skills, conduct, and attitudes needed to collaborate, build consensus, and work toward common goals with 16 others, which are skills essential to supporting and sustaining 17 a vibrant representative democracy and a society guided by the 18 19 principles of productivity and interdependency; and 20 21 WHEREAS, students who participate on the Board of Education 22 while simultaneously pursuing academic goals in school, can also 23 learn the value of service to their peers, schools, and the 24 Department of Education; and 25 26 WHEREAS, by participating on the Board of Education, 27 students may have to miss classes to attend meetings; now, 28 therefore, 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 31 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 32 Session of 2007, that the Board of Education is urged to adopt 33 administrative rules to allow the Department of Education to 34 grant elective school credit to the student member of the Board of Education; and 35 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature requests that any elective school credit granted apply toward the student's 38 39 graduation requirements; and



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of
Education and the Superintendent of Education.
