
HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO IMPROVE ITS DELIVERY
OF SERVICES TO SPECIAL NEEDS CHILDREN AND THEIR FAMILIES BY
RECONSIDERING THE RATES PAID TO INTENSIVE INSTRUCTIONAL
SERVICES CONSULTANTS.

1 WHEREAS, since the lifting of the Felix consent decree in
2 2005, the Department of Education has decreased its spending on
3 special education contracts; and
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5 WHEREAS, parents of special education students have noted
6 that some services for their children have gradually been
7 eliminated and that the number of available intensive
8 instructional services consultants are being restricted; and
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10 WHEREAS, services provided by intensive instructional
11 services consultants include skills training, parent training,
12 and supportive services for children with special needs; and
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14 WHEREAS, the rates paid for these services have been
15 changed, standardized, or capped by the Department of Education;
16 and
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18 WHEREAS, the Legislature understands that there is a need
19 to establish a standard rate for intensive instructional
20 services consultants and that proposed consultant rates are
21 scheduled to take effect July 1, 2007; and
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23 WHEREAS, families in need of psychiatric services through
24 the Department of Education may suffer or experience hardship
25 due to the new rates paid to consultants; and
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27 WHEREAS, given the requirements of the No Child Left Behind
28 Act, the State of Hawaii can ill afford a loss of services to
29 special needs children; now, therefore,
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31 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
32 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
33 Session of 2007, that the Department of Education is requested



1 to review the discrepancies between the current rates paid to
2 intensive instructional services consultants and the proposed
3 rates that are scheduled to take effect on July 1, 2007, as well
4 as determine the impact of the proposed rates on special needs
5 students and their families; and
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7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is
8 requested to report its findings and recommendations to the
9 Legislature and to members of the general public prior to July
10 1, 2007; and
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12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is
13 requested to designate the area of Honoka'a on the island of
14 Hawaii as "rural" to qualify for the nine per cent differential
15 rate in intensive instructional services consultant rates; and
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17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is
18 requested to engage behavioral health specialists, as well as
19 parents of children in need of intensive instructional services
20 consultants, in discussions using professional and unbiased
21 facilitators to promote a positive exchange of information; and
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23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
24 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of
25 Education and the Superintendent of Education.
