HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO EXAMINE THE PROCEDURES, IF ANY, THAT OTHER STATES AND JURISDICTIONS UTILIZE TO REVIEW THE DEVELOPMENT OF PROPOSED NEW MAJOR HEALTH CARE FACILITIES.

WHEREAS, under current law, no person, public or private, 1 nonprofit or for profit, may construct, expand, alter, convert, 2 develop, initiate, or modify a health care facility or health 3 care service that requires a total capital expenditure in excess 4 of \$4,000,000 for capital expenditures, \$1,000,000 for new or 5 replacement medical equipment, or \$400,000 for used medical 6 equipment, without first obtaining a certificate of need from 7 the State Health Planning and Development Agency, sometimes, 8 referred to as SHPDA; and 9

WHEREAS, once an application is filed with SHPDA and is 11 deemed complete, the application is submitted to the subarea 12 13 health planning council for the area where the new facility or service is being proposed, of which at least one is established 14 in each county, to review, take public input, and make 15 recommendations on the application for the certificate of need 16 to SHPDA; and 17

WHEREAS, the application for the certificate of need is 19 20 next forwarded to a statewide review panel, which shall include at least one member from each county and the majority of whose 21 members shall be consumers, for its review and recommendation; 22 and 23

WHEREAS, the application of the certificate of need is next 25 26 forwarded to the statewide health coordinating council, that is advisory to SHPDA and whose members are appointed by the 27 Governor, and include both health care providers and health care 28 consumers; and 29

WHEREAS, the statewide health coordinating council is 31 mandated, in part, to advise SHPDA with regard to the state 32 certificate of need program; and 33

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1 WHEREAS, following the reviews and recommendations of the 2 subarea health planning council, review panel, and statewide 3 health coordinating council, the administrator of SHPDA, a 4 single individual, makes a decision on the application for a 5 certificate of need for the proposed new major medical facility 6 7 or medical service; and 8 WHEREAS, the decision of the administrator of SHPDA is then 9 subject to a request by any person for a public hearing and 10 review of the decision by a reconsideration committee that may 11 12 reverse the decision of the SHPDA administrator for good cause shown; and 13 14 WHEREAS, if the final decision by SHPDA or the 15 reconsideration committee results in a denial of an application 16 for a certificate of need, the applicant may appeal the SHPDA 17 decision to the circuit court, in accordance with Chapter 91, 18 Hawaii Revised Statutes, relating to reviews of agency actions; 19 20 and 21 WHEREAS, this process of applying for a certificate of need 22 for any new major medical facility or medical service is 23 repetitive, time-consuming, and expensive; and 24 25 WHEREAS, it is illogical to allow one individual to make a 26 decision that may involve an investment of hundreds of millions 27 28 of dollars in any new major medical facility and that would impact the provision of needed medical services to an entire 29 community; and 30 31 WHEREAS, many other states and jurisdictions that had 32 33 implemented similar procedures for the review of proposals for new major medical facilities or medical services have eliminated 34 or modified these cumbersome procedures; now, therefore, 35 36 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 37 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 38 Session of 2007, that the Legislative Reference Bureau is 39 requested to examine the procedures utilized in other states and 40 jurisdictions, if any, for the review and approval of proposals 41 for new major medical facilities; and 42 43



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference
Bureau is requested to submit a report containing its findings
to the Legislature not later than twenty days prior to the
convening of the Regular Session 2008; and
